

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# Chapter 1 Overview

Before using the camera, read this chapter.

## Before using the camera

#### ■ Before using the camera, always check if the built-in battery is not consumed, and then set the date/time.

The internal clock of the camera is reset when the built-in battery has been consumed. This may result in the meta data of the clip not recorded correctly, and it may not display correctly in the thumbnail screen.

Check if the built-in battery is not consumed before using. (page 45)

Also, set the correct date/time. (page 46)

#### When using this product during rain or snow or when at the beach, be careful that water does not get inside the camera.

Water causes damage to the camera and memory card. (Repair may be impossible)

#### ■ Keep the camera away from devices that produce magnetism (TVs, TV games, etc.).

- Do not use the camera on top of a TV or around it. Image or audio of the camera may be distorted by the electromagnetic wave emitted from a TV.
- The recorded content may be damaged or image may be distorted by a strong magnetic field produced by speaker or large motor.
- Do not use the camera on top of a microcomputer or around it. Image or audio of the camera may be distorted by the electromagnetic wave emitted from a microcomputer.
- The camera may not operate properly due to a harmful effect from a device producing magnetism. In such case, turn off the camera and either remove the battery or unplug the AC adaptor from the power outlet. Then, mount the battery or connect the AC adaptor again. After that, turn on the camera.

#### ■ Do not use the camera near a radio transmitter or high-voltage device.

Using the camera recorder near a radio transmitter or high-voltage device may cause harmful effect to the recorded video or audio.

#### ■ Take care so sand and/or dust do not get inside the camera when using the camera at the beach, etc.

Sand and dust may damage the camera and memory card. (Be careful when inserting or removing the memory card)

#### AC adaptor, battery charger, and battery

- It may take more time to charge or may not be able to charge when the temperature of the battery is extremely high or extremely low.
- When the charging lamp continues to flash in orange, check if there is any debris, foreign object, or dirt attached to the terminal section of the battery
  or the battery charger, and reconnect it correctly. Always disconnect the power plug from the power outlet before removing the debris, foreign object,
  or dirt attached to the terminal section.
- The charging lamp will flash in orange when the temperature of the battery is extremely high or low.

Then, charging will start automatically after the battery reaches chargeable temperature.

- If the charging lamp continues to flash even when the battery is at its optimal temperature, the battery or battery charger may be damaged. Consult the dealer.
- Noise may be generated in radio when the camera is used close to a radio (especially when receiving AM). Keep a distance of 1 m or more when using.
- Oscillating sound may generate inside the AC adaptor or the battery charger during the use, but this is not a malfunction.
- Always disconnect the power plug from the power outlet after the use. (Power of approximately 0.1 W is consumed by the AC power itself if kept connected)
- Do not get the terminal section of the AC adaptor, the battery charger, or the battery dirty. Install the device close to the power outlet so the disconnection device (power plug) can be easily reached.

#### ■ SD card

- Surface of camera or the SD card may get slightly hot when used for a long period of time, but this is not a malfunction.
- The memory capacity described on the label of the SD card is a total of following capacities.
- Capacity to protect and manage copyright
- Capacity usable as the normal memory on the camera or a PC.
- Do not apply strong impact, bend, or drop the SD card.
- Data in the SD card may get destroyed or erased in following cases.
- Electrical noise or static electricity
- Malfunction of the camera or the SD card
- Do not perform following operations when accessing the SD card (card 1 access lamp/card 2 access lamp is flashing in orange).
- Removing the SD card
- Disconnecting battery or the AC adaptor without turning off the camera
- Apply vibration of impact

#### ■ Take care not to drop the camera when carrying the camera.

- Strong impact will damage the camera, and it may not operate properly.
- Hold the handle or grip when carrying the camera, and handle it carefully.

## ■ Do not apply insecticide or volatile material to the camera.

- The camera may deform or the paint may peel off when insecticide or volatile material is applied.
- Do not allow the camera to remain in contact with a rubber or vinyl object for a long period of time.

#### ■ Disconnect the battery or disconnect the AC cable from the power outlet after the use.

#### Battery characteristics

The battery is a rechargeable lithium-ion battery. It produces electrical energy via an internal chemical reaction. This chemical reaction is effected by the ambient temperature and humidity. The usable time of the battery becomes shorter when the temperature gets higher or lower. When used in an environment with extremely low temperature, it can only be used for approximately five minutes.

When the battery is in an extremely hot environment, its protective function will operate and the camera recorder cannot be used temporarily.

#### After using the camera recorder, be sure to remove the battery.

Securely remove the battery from the camera.

(Minute current is consumed even if the camera is turned off when the battery is kept mounted)

The battery will become over discharge and may become unusable even if it is recharged when the battery is kept mounted for long period of time.

Do not remove the battery when the power is turned on.

Turn off the power and remove the battery after the operation lamp goes completely out.

#### Take proper care of the battery terminal.

Do not allow dust or foreign objects on the battery terminal.

Confirm that the battery and its terminal section is not deformed when the battery is dropped by mistake.

Do not mount the deformed battery into a camera or mount to the battery charger. This may damage the camera or the battery charger.

#### ■ Cautions when throwing memory cards away or transferring them to others

Formatting memory cards or deleting data using the functions of the camera or a computer will merely change the file management information: it will not completely erase the data on the cards.

It is recommended to completely erase the data in following method when discarding/conveying.

- Physically destroy the memory card itself
- Completely erase the data in the memory card using a commercially available data erasing software for PC, etc.

Users are responsible for managing the data stored in their memory card.

#### ■ LCD monitor

- Do not continuously display the same image or text on the LCD monitor for a long period of time. The image may be burned on to the screen. It will return to normal after leaving the camera recorder turned off for several hours.
- Condensation sometimes forms on the LCD panel of the LCD monitor in locations subject to extreme temperature differences. If this happens, wipe with a soft, dry cloth.
- The LCD monitor will be slightly darker than normal immediately after the power is turned on when the camera is very cold. It will return to its regular brightness when the internal temperature increases.
- The LCD monitor is precisely managed so that at least 99.99% of the dots are effective pixels, but there may be 0.01% or less of pixels that are missing or always lit. This is not a malfunction and it has no effect whatsoever on the recorded images.
- It may become difficult to see or difficult to recognize the touch when a LCD protection sheet is affixed.

#### Do not point the lens toward the sun.

Doing so might damage the components inside.

#### ■ Caution regarding laser beams

The MOS sensor may be damaged if the MOS sensor is subjected to light from a laser beam.

Take sufficient care to prevent laser beams from striking the lens when shooting in an environment where laser devices are used.

#### Note the following points.

- If you prepare to record important images, always shoot some advance test footage to verify that both pictures and sound are being recorded normally.
- Panasonic will not assume liability when video or audio recording fails due to a malfunction of the camera or the memory card during the use.
- Set the calendar (datetime of the internal clock) and the time zone, or check the setting before recording. This will have an effect on the management of the recorded contents.

#### Chapter 1 Overview — Before using the camera

- In order to prevent malicious attacks, use the authentication system and change the default setting values by using 8 characters or more including 3 or more character types for the authentication information (such as user name and password) so that a third party cannot guess your authentication information
- Store the authentication information (user name, password, etc.) appropriately so it is not visible to the third party.
- Periodically change the authentication information (user name, password, etc.).
- To prevent the setting information in the camera to leak to the network, execute measure such as restricting the access with user authentication, etc.
- Do not install in a location where the camera, cable, etc., can be easily damaged.



## Setting the region of use

The camera is shipped with the region of use not set.

[AREA SETTINGS] is displayed in the LCD monitor when the power is turned on for the first time.

Follow the guidance and make the settings in the order of [AREA SETTINGS], [TIME ZONE], and then [CLOCK SETTING].

There are two methods of operation, a method to operate with the multidial, or a method to touch the LCD monitor.

## [AREA SETTINGS]

Set the region of use.



1 Connect the charged battery or the AC adaptor to the camera, and set the power switch to < | > (ON).
The [AREA SETTINGS] screen is displayed.

2 Select the region of use.

[AREA 1]: Japan, Taiwan, South Korea

[AREA 2]: United States of America, Canada, Central and South America regions

[AREA 3]: Asia region (excluding Japan, Taiwan, South Korea), Oceania region, India

3 When the confirmation message is displayed, select [YES].

The camera will be initialized in accordance to the region selected in Step 2. The camera will automatically restart.



- Once this is set, the [AREA SETTINGS] screen is not displayed from the next startup.
- To change the region of use, set with the [OPTION] menu → [AREA SETTINGS].

## [TIME ZONE]

Once the setting for [AREA SETTINGS] is completed, the [TIME ZONE] screen is displayed.

Set the time difference from the Greenwich Mean Time.



- 1 Set the time difference.
- 2 Select [SET].

# [CLOCK SETTING]

Once the setting for [TIME ZONE] is completed, the [CLOCK SETTING] screen is displayed. Set the year, month, date, and time.



- 1 Set the year, month, date, and time.
- 2 Select [SET].

Once the setting is completed, the VIEW screen is displayed in the LCD monitor.



## Connecting to monitor

A monitor can be connected to output images.

- Use the double shielded cable supporting 4K/60P as the HDMI cable (optional). It is also recommended to use the Panasonic 4K/60P compatible HDMI cable.
- For the BNC cable (optional) connected to the <SDI OUT> terminal, prepare a double-shielded cable equivalent to 5C-FB.



## Remote operation by iPad or Android terminal

The camera can be connected to the wireless LAN by connecting a wireless module compatible to the camera to the <USB2.0 HOST> terminal of camera.

Following operations are possible by connecting the camera with an iPad or an Android terminal with EVA ROP app installed.

- Checking camera status
- Camera remote control (recording control, camera setting such as shutter, EXPOSURE INDEX, iris, or white balance, and checking the time code)
- Menu Operations



## Camera

## Left side

Following terminal is inside the cover.

<LCD> terminal



## 1 Accessory mounting section

The included LCD monitor mounting attachment can also be mounted.

## 2 HDMI cable clamp

Fixes the HDMI cable.

## 3 Microphone cable clamp

Fixes the external microphone cable.

## 4 Microphone holder mounting section

Mounts the included microphone holder adaptor and the microphone holder.

## 5 LCD monitor cable clamp

Fixes the cable for the LCD monitor unit.

#### 6 Focus hook

Indicates the position of the image surface plane of the image sensor.

## 7 Grip mounting section

Mounts the included grip.

#### 8 <LCD> terminal

Connects the cable for the LCD monitor unit.

#### 9 <REMOTE> terminal

Connects the cable for grip.


#### 10 <GRIP RELEASE> button

Used when removing the grip from the camera.

## 11 Grip cable clamp

Fixes the grip cable.

## Right side



#### 1 LCD monitor unit mounting section

Mounts the included LCD monitor mounting attachment.

#### 2 Handle

This is a removable handle.

Already mounted to the camera.

#### 3 REC button

Starts or stops the recording.

#### 4 <ND FILTER> button

Switches the ND filter by pressing the <+> button or the <-> button.

The set value can be checked in the ND filter display of the VIEW screen. Displayed contents of the ND filter display are as follows.

[ND:1.8]: Reduces the amount of light entering the MOS sensor to 1/64.

[ND:1.2]: Reduces the amount of light entering the MOS sensor to 1/16.

[ND:0.6]: Reduces the amount of light entering the MOS sensor to 1/4.

[ND:CLR]: The ND filter is not used.

## 5 <IRIS> dial

Controls the iris of the EF lens.

Turn upward: Controls toward closing.

Turn downward: Controls toward opening.

Press: Switches between <AUTO>/<MANU>.

## 6 <MENU> button

Displays the menu. Pressing the <MENU> button while the menu is displayed closes the menu.

## 7 <AWB>/<USER 6> button

Adjusts the white balance.

Also, this is also used as the USER button (USER6).

## 8 Accessory mounting section

The included LCD monitor mounting attachment can also be mounted.

#### 9 <CH1> switch

Selects the method to adjust the audio input level for the <AUDIO INPUT 1> terminal.

<a href="#">AUTO>: Adjusts automatically.</a>

<MANU>: Adjusts with the <AUDIO LEVEL CH1> knob.

### 10 < AUDIO LEVEL CH1> knob

Adjusts the audio input level when the <CH1> switch is set to <MANU>.

#### 11 <AUDIO LEVEL CH2> knob

Adjusts the audio input level when the <CH2> switch is set to <MANU>.

#### 12 <CH2> switch

Selects the method to adjust the audio input level for the <AUDIO INPUT 2> terminal.

<a href="#">AUTO>: Adjusts automatically.</a>

<MANU>: Adjusts with the <AUDIO LEVEL CH2> knob.

#### 13 Power lamp

Indicates the status of power. Illuminates in red when the power is on.

To flash the lamp or not can be set in the menu.

#### 14 Built-in speaker

Outputs audio during playback.

Audio is not output from the built-in speaker when headphones are connected to the headphone terminal.

#### 15 USER buttons (<USER 1>, <USER 2>/<VIEW>, <USER 3>/<INFO>)

A function selected by the user can be assigned to each button. Pressing the button while the VIEW screen is displayed will perform the assigned function.

Pressing the button while displaying the HOME screen will perform the operation of the <VIEW>/<INFO> button displayed in orange in the camera. Pressing the <VIEW> button will display the VIEW screen, and pressing the <INFO> button will display the INFO screen.

#### 16 <E.I.S.>/<USER 4> button

Enables/disables the electronic image stabilization function.

Also, this is also used as the USER button (USER4).

#### 17 <WFM>/<USER 5> button

Displays/hides the waveform monitor displayed on the LCD monitor.

Also, this is also used as the USER button (USER5).

#### 18 <LOCK> switch

Sliding toward the <  $\triangle$  > side disables the operations other than the power switch.

Sets the button and switch to disable the operation in the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [SIDE LOCK].

#### 19 <WB>/<USER>/<ISO/dB> switch

Use by switching between <WB> (white balance)/<USER> (USER button)/<ISO/dB> (gain adjustment) functions.

The selected function is operated with the multidial.

#### 20 Multidial

Moves, selects, and sets the menu while the menu is displayed.

Also, operates the selected function with the <WB>/<USER>/<ISO/dB> switch.

#### 21 <EXIT> button

Returns to one level higher when the menu is displayed. Pressing the <EXIT> button without confirming the setting value will not reflect the change in the setting.

#### 22 <HOME> button

Displays the HOME screen on the LCD monitor.

#### 23 <THUMBNAIL> button

Displays the thumbnail screen on the LCD monitor.


Pressing the <THUMBNAIL> button again displays the VIEW screen.

#### 24 Power switch

Switches between power on/standby.

To turn on, set the power switch to < |> (ON). To set to standby, set the power switch to <  $\bigcirc$  > (standby).

## Front side



#### 1 Light sensor

Detects indoor and outdoor light.

When using the auto tracking white balance (ATW), do not obstruct the light sensor.

#### 2 Built-in microphone

This is the built-in stereo microphone <L>/<R>.

#### 3 Front tally lamp

Illuminates when the recording is started. Flashes when the battery level becomes low.

To flash the lamp or not can be set in the menu.

#### 4 EF lens mount

EF lens is mounted.

• The figure shows the status when the mount cap is attached. Remove the mount cap when the lens is to be mounted.

#### 5 Lens lock unlock button

The lock is unlocked when the lens is to be removed from the camera.


#### 6 Fan inlet

Fan inlet for cooling fan. Do not block this while the camera is being used.

Following terminals, card slots, and card access lamps are inside the cover.

- <HDMI> terminal
- <USB2.0 HOST> terminal

- SDI OUT> terminal

- Card 1 access lamp/card 2 access lamp



#### 1 Card 1 access lamp

Indicates the access status for recording and playback of the SD card inserted in the card slot 1. To flash the lamp or not can be set in the menu.

#### 2 Card slot 1

Slot for SD card.

#### 3 Card slot 2

Slot for SD card.

#### 4 Card 2 access lamp

Indicates the access status for recording and playback of the SD card inserted in the card slot 2. To flash the lamp or not can be set in the menu.

#### 5 <SLOT SEL>/<USER 7> button

Selects the card slot to record to or playback from.

Also, this is also used as the USER button (USER7).

#### 6 Rear tally lamp

Illuminates when the recording is started. Flashes when the battery level becomes low. To flash the lamp or not can be set in the menu.

#### 7 <AUDIO INPUT 1>/<AUDIO INPUT 2> terminal (XLR, 3-pin)

Connects an audio equipment or an external microphone.

#### 8 <HDMI> terminal

A terminal to output video signal by connecting a monitor, etc.

#### 9 <USB2.0 HOST> terminal

Can connect to wireless LAN when the wireless module (optional) compatible to camera is mounted.

#### 10 <SERVICE> terminal

A maintenance terminal.

#### 11 Battery release button

Used when removing the battery from the camera.

#### 12 Headphone terminal

Connects audio monitoring headphones.

#### 13 <SDI OUT> terminal

A terminal to output SDI signal by connecting a monitor, etc.

#### 14 Fan outlet

Fan outlet for cooling fan. Do not block this while the camera is being used.

## 15 Battery mounting section

Mounts a battery.

#### 16 <DC IN 12V> terminal

Connects the supplied AC adaptor and supplies an external power supply.


#### 17 <TC IN/OUT> terminal

Connects to an external equipment and output/input a time code.

Inputs the standard time code when locking the time code with an external equipment.

Input and output are set in the [REC SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [TC]  $\rightarrow$  [TC IN/OUT SEL].

## 1 Shoulder strap mounting section

Mounts the included shoulder strap. (page 40)

## 2 Accessory shoe

Attaches the video light.

#### 3 Accessory mounting holes

Mounts the handle and accessory such as the LCD monitor unit.



  - 1/4-20 UNC (screw length 5.5 mm or shorter)

#### 4 Handle accessory mounting hole

Mounts an accessory to the top of the handle.




## 1 Tripod holes

- Attach the tripod.

## **LCD** monitor unit



#### 1 LCD monitor hood

Blocks the light from outside, making it easier to view the LCD monitor.

#### 2 LCD monitor

Displays the screen to set the basic setting of the camera and check the status of the camera.

In addition to the HOME screen that is the starting point of the operation, the VIEW screen that displays the recording image, the INFO screen that displays the information of the camera, etc., can be displayed.

Supports the touch operation.

## 3 LCD monitor mounting attachment

Mounts to the LCD monitor mounting section of the handle, etc.

#### 4 <MIRROR> switch


Inverts the VIEW screen vertically or both vertically and horizontally.

<OFF>: Does not invert.
<B/T>: Inverts vertically.

**ROTATE>:** Inverts vertically and horizontally.

## Grip

The grip is already mounted to the camera.



## 1 <EXIT>/<USER 8> button

Returns to one level higher from the current menu when the menu is displayed. Pressing the <EXIT> button without confirming the setting value will not reflect the change in the setting.

Can be used as the USER button (USER8) while displaying the VIEW screen.

#### 2 REC button

Starts or stops the recording.

#### 3 <MENU> button

Displays the menu. Pressing the <MENU> button while the menu is displayed closes the menu.

#### 4 <USER 9> button

Can be used as the USER button (USER9) while displaying the VIEW screen.

## 5 Grip mounting section

Mounts to the grip mounting section of the camera.

## 6 Grip rotation lever

Pulling to <UNLOCK> side allows to adjust the position of the grip by rotating it.

#### 7 Grip belt

Already mounted to the grip.

### 8 Grip multidial

Moves, selects, and sets the menu while the menu is displayed.

Also, this can be used to control the iris of the EF lens.

## **Basic operation**

## Multidial operation

Operate the multidial on the camera by turning it in vertical direction or pushing it.

- Turning the multidial in vertical direction will move the cursor.
- Pressing the multidial will select or confirm the item with cursor.



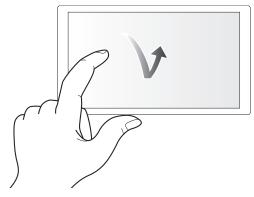
- · For details on menu operation method, refer to "When operating with the multidial".
- · The grip multidial operates equally as the multidial on the camera.

## Touch operation of the LCD monitor

The LCD monitor can be operated by directly touching with a finger.

Do not touch the LCD monitor with a pointed hard object such as a ball point pen.

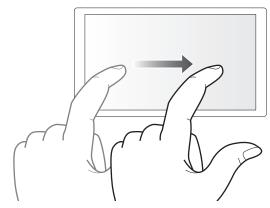
#### ■ Touching



An operation to press and release the LCD monitor. An item or icon can be selected, or an item can be executed.

- To select an icon, touch the center of the icon.
- It will not operate while touching a different location of the LCD monitor.

#### ■ Sliding



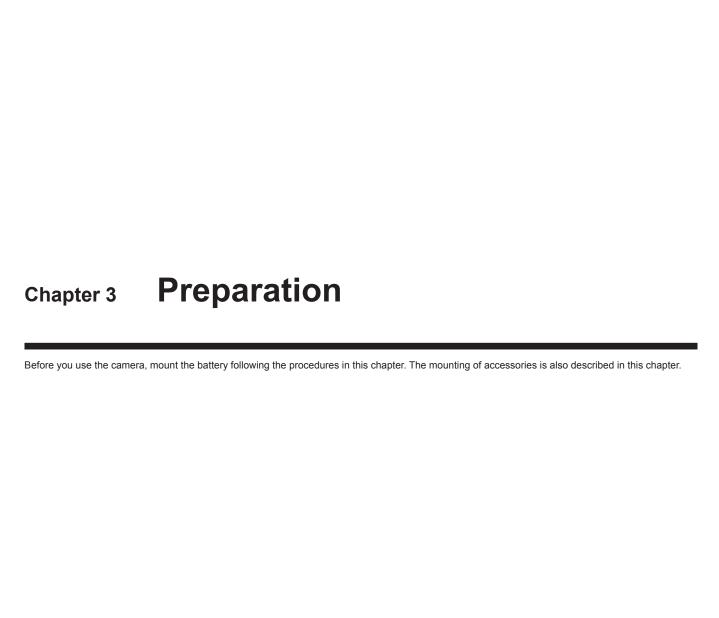
An operation to move a finger while touching the LCD monitor. Playback operation such as the skip playback or direct playback, etc. can be performed.

#### ■ Touching and holding

An operation to keep on pressing, then releasing the LCD monitor. Values of the menu or the pages of the thumbnail screen can be changed continuously.

## **Power supply**


A battery or the supplied AC adaptor can be used as the power supply for the camera.

- The camera is compatible to following batteries. (As of October 2017)
- AG-VBR59 (supplied/optional, supports quick charging)
- AG-VBR89 (optional, supports quick charging)
- AG-VBR118 (optional, supports quick charging)
- VW-VBD58 (optional)

## **Charging the battery**

The battery is not charged at the time of purchase. Fully charge the battery in the battery charger before using the battery. It is recommended that you have one extra battery.


- It is recommended to perform charging of the batter in a location with ambient temperature of 10 °C to 30 °C (same for the battery temperature).
- The supplied AC cable is dedicated for this camera. Do not use with any other device. Also, do not use AC cable from other device on this camera.
- The supplied battery charger can simultaneously charge two batteries. Also, it is compatible with the quick charge battery.




Fig. 1 Fig. 2

- 1 Connect the DC plug of the AC adaptor to the <DC IN 12V> terminal of the battery charger. (Fig. 1)
- f 2 Connect the AC cable to the AC adaptor. (Fig. 2)
  - Insert the AC cable all the way in until it stops.
- 3 Connect the power plug to the power outlet. (Fig. 2)
- 4 Mount the battery to the battery charger. (Fig. 3)

The charging lamp of the side the mounted battery will illuminate, and the charging will start.

- $\bullet$  Place the battery horizontally along the  $\begin{cal}\longleftarrow\\$  mark, and slide it.
- Once the charging is completed, the <CHARGE1>/<CHARGE2> lamp (charging lamp) will turn off. Slide the battery and remove it.
- Display of the <CHARGE1>/<CHARGE2> lamp



The <CHARGE1>/<CHARGE2> lamp (charging lamp) of the supplied battery charger indicates the charging status as follows.

Orange (illuminated)	Normal charging	
Orange (flashing)	Stopped charging due to an error	
Off	Charging is completed or the battery is not mounted	

# NOTE

- The battery charger will determine the status of the battery after the battery is mounted. Therefore, it may take some time until the charging lamp is to illuminate. Mount the battery again if the charging lamp does not illuminate after ten seconds or longer has elapsed.
- When two quick charging compatible batteries are mounted, the quick charging on the <CHARGE1> side will take priority, and the charging on the <CHARGE2> side will be normal charging. Once the charging of the <CHARGE1> side proceeds, the charging on the <CHARGE2> side will switch to quick charging.
- Also, depending on the charging status of the battery, the indicator on the battery that is mounted on the <CHARGE2> side may turn off.
- The battery charger will perform optimal charging after determining the status of the battery. Once the charging is started, the indicator for quick charging compatible battery will flash. Also, if it is charging on both <CHARGE1> side and <CHARGE2> side, charging of both batteries will stop when either one of the battery is mounted/removed, or replaced. It will start the charging again after determining the status of the batteries.
- · Mount the battery to be charged prioritized on the <CHARGE1> side when charging.

- The charging time is the time when charged using the supplied battery charger.
- The charging time is the time when the operating ambient temperature is 25 °C and operating relative humidity is 60%. At other temperature and humidity the charging time may take longer.
- The charging time is the time to charge when the charging capacity of the battery is used up. The charging time or the continuous recordable time differs depending on the use condition such as high or low temperature.
- The continuous recordable time is the time when the camera is used in following condition. If you use the camera in other conditions, continuous shootable time will shorten.
- Condition where the LCD monitor and the grip are mounted with the factory default menu settings.
- Condition where the cable is not connected to the external input/output terminal



- Battery is warm after using or after charging, but this is not a malfunction.
- The battery can be charged with the battery charger AG-B23 (DE-A88) (optional), but it will take longer to charge.

#### Checking the remaining battery level

The remaining battery level can be checked with the power supply status display on the LCD monitor or the indicator on the supplied battery.

#### Checking the remaining battery level with the LCD monitor


The battery status display will change as  $\P$   $\to \P$   $\to \P$   $\to \P$  while the remaining battery level gets lower. It will flash in red when the remaining battery level is zero.



- · The power supply status display may not be displayed depending on the setting in the menu.
- · Repair or copy of the clip, or update of the firmware is not possible when it is flashing in red.

#### Checking the remaining battery level with the battery

- The remaining battery level can be checked with the indicator display by pressing the <CHECK> button on the battery when it is not charging.
- The remaining battery level is a rough indication.
- The indicator will not illuminate even if the <CHECK> button is pressed when the remaining battery level is zero. Charge the battery.
- The progress of the charging is notified by the flashing position of the indicator while the battery is charging.
   Once the charging is completed, the indicator turns off.




## Attaching and removing the battery

## Attaching the battery



- 1 Press the battery against the battery mounting section of the camera, and mount it by sliding it downward.
  - Press in the battery until it clicks and gets locked.

## Removing the battery



- Battery release button
- 1 Set the power switch to < (b) > (standby).
  - Check that the power lamp is turned off.
- 2 While pressing the battery release button on the camera, slide the battery upward and remove it.

## Using the AC adaptor

#### Attaching the AC adaptor

Use the supplied AC adaptor. Do not use an AC adaptor for other device.

The supplied AC cable is dedicated for this camera. Do not use with any other device. Also, do not use AC cable from other device on this camera.

- 1 Connect the AC cable to the AC adaptor. (Fig. 1)
  - Insert the AC cable all the way in until it stops.
- 2 Connect the power plug to the power outlet. (Fig. 1)
- 3 Connect the AC adaptor to the <DC IN 12V> terminal. (Fig. 2)
  - When removing the AC adaptor, always set the power switch to < 🖒 > (standby), and check that the power lamp is turned off before removing.



## NOTE NOTE

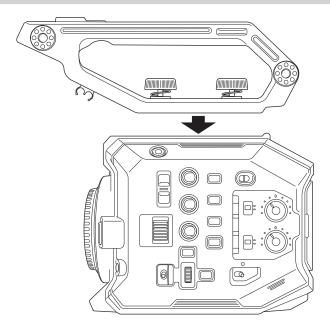
- · To record with the AC adaptor connected, mount the battery in case there is a power outage or disconnection of the power outlet.
- The power is consumed even when the power switch is set to < 🖒 > (standby). To prevent power consumption, disconnect the AC adaptor from the power outlet when it is not used for a long period of time.
- The battery charger and the AC adaptor is designed to operate regardless of the country or region in use. This operates with power supply voltage of 100 V-240 V, and power supply frequency of 50 Hz or 60 Hz. However, the shape of the power outlet differs depending on the country or the region. Prepare a plug that fits the shape of the power outlet. Consult the dealer for conversion plug.

# **Mounting accessories**

## Handle

The handle is already mounted to the camera.

## Mounting the handle



1 Mount the handle to the accessory mounting holes at the top of the camera body using the handle mounting screws (x 2).



• Use the handle after securely tightening the handle mounting screws (x 2). Using without securely tightening them may cause the camera to fall due to handle coming off.



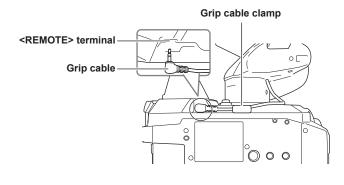







Fig. 1 Fig. 2

- 1 Insert the grip to the camera. (Fig. 1)
  - Align the mount reference points on the grip mounting section of the camera and the grip mounting section of the grip when inserting into the camera.
- 2 Slowly turn the grip counter-clockwise until it clicks. (Fig. 2)
- 3 Connect the grip cable to the <REMOTE> terminal. (Fig. 3)
- 4 Fix the grip cable with the grip cable clamp. (Fig. 3)

## NOTE

- If it does not mount correctly, perform the mounting from the beginning. Do not apply excessive force to the grip and the camera.
- Store the grip cable inside the grip cable clamp. If it is not stored, the cable may fly out to bottom when the angle of grip is changed, or it may get caught when mounting a tripod.
- Try not to hold the whole camera only with the grip with the total mass of the whole camera has increased by attaching multiple accessories to the camera main body. The grip may get damaged.







  - Connect after confirming that ▼ of the LCD monitor unit cable connection terminal is facing outward.

The LCD monitor can be turned vertically and horizontally to adjust to easily viewable angle.

The VIEW screen can be inverted vertically or inverted vertically and horizontally by the <MIRROR> switch allowing the mirror shooting, etc. It is recommended to close the LCD monitor to protect the LCD monitor when the camera is not used or to be carried.



### Removing the LCD monitor unit



1 Remove in the reverse procedure as mounting.

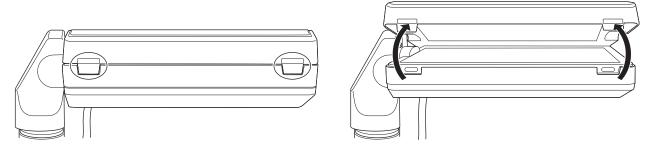


• To disconnect the LCD monitor unit cable, pull out while pressing on the lock buttons on both sides of the cable connection terminal (▼).






### Mounting the LCD monitor hood

Mount the supplied shoulder strap to the shoulder strap mounting section.



### Mounting the external microphone

External microphone such as the super-directional microphone AG-MC200G (optional) can be mounted onto the handle.



- 1 Mount the supplied microphone holder adaptor to the microphone mounting section of the camera. (Fig. 1)
  - Tighten the screw included with the microphone holder adaptor.
- 2 Mount the included microphone holder to the microphone holder adaptor using the microphone holder screws (x 2). (Fig. 2)
- ${f 3}$  Mount the external microphone and tighten the screw on the microphone holder. (Fig. 3)
- 4 Connect the microphone cable to the <AUDIO INPUT 1> terminal. (Fig. 4)
- 5 Attach the microphone cable to the microphone cable clamp. (Fig. 4)



• Remove the microphone cable from the <AUDIO INPUT 1> terminal while pushing the lever.

## Mounting the lens

Mount/remove the lens in a location away from direct sunlight or intense lighting.

Take care not to drop the camera or the lens.

Prevent dirt or dust from entering into the EF lens mount.





- 1 Set the power switch to < (b) > (standby).
  - Check that the power lamp is turned off.



### Attaching a tripod


The tripod attachment holes accept 1/4-20 UNC and 3/8-16 UNC screws. Use the hole that matches the diameter of the clamping screw on the tripod.





- · Use a tripod in safe locations.
- The depth of the tripod attachment hole is 5.5 mm. Do not over-tighten the tripod screw when mounting the camera to a tripod.

## Turning on/off the power



## How to turn on the power

### 1 Set the power switch to < > (ON).

The power lamp will illuminate in red when the power is on.

• The [AREA SETTINGS] screen is displayed when the power is turned on for the first time. Set the region of use, date, time, and time zone.



- The internal battery (rechargeable battery) will discharge. The setting for date/time may be initialized when the camera is not turned on for approximately two months.
- Set the date/time again after charging the built-in battery. (page 45)
- The power lamp will not illuminate or flash when the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [LED & FAN] → [POWER LED] → [OFF] is set. However, it will illuminate for approximately 1 second during startup.

### How to turn off the power

### 1 Set the power switch to < ( > (standby).

The power lamp will turn off.

## Charging the built-in battery

The date/time set in the camera is maintained by the built-in battery.

The built-in battery may exhaust when the camera is not turned on for approximately two months.

The built-in battery is exhausted when [BACKUP BATT EMPTY] is displayed on the LCD monitor when the power switch is set to < > (ON). Charge the built-in battery with the following procedure.

- 1 Set the power switch to < (b) > (standby).
- ${f 2}$  Connect a fully charged battery or the AC adaptor to the camera.

For details on connection of a battery or the AC adaptor, refer to "Power supply".

3 Leave the camera for approx. 24 hours.

The built-in battery will be charged.

The built-in battery is charged even when the power switch is set to < > (ON).

- Check the date/time setting and the time code after charging.
- Select [DIAGNOSTICS] in the INFO screen, and set the date/time for the internal clock if [INTERNAL CLOCK HAS RESET] [<PLEASE SET TO CORRECT TIME>] is displayed in the warning display field.
- 4 Set the power switch to < | > (ON), and check that [BACKUP BATT EMPTY] is not displayed in the LCD monitor.

If [BACKUP BATT EMPTY] is still displayed after charging, the built-in battery needs to be replaced. Consult your dealer.

## Setting the date/time of the internal clock

The date/time/time zone are recorded as meta data in the clip while shooting.

It will affect the management of the recorded contents, so always check and set the date/time and time zone before using the camera for the first time. Do not change the setting of the date/time and time zone while shooting.

### 1 Press the <MENU> button.

The menu is displayed.

- 2 Select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [CLOCK]  $\rightarrow$  [TIME ZONE], and set the time difference from Greenwich Mean Time.
- $\textbf{3} \hspace{0.1cm} \textbf{Select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \textbf{[CLOCK]} \rightarrow \textbf{[CLOCK SETTING]}, \text{ and set the year, month, date, and time.}$



- · Accuracy of the clock is approximately ±30 seconds per month. Check and reset the time when accurate time is required.
- In the AVCHD format, clip will be save in +12:30 even selecting +12:45 due to format standards.

## Preparing the SD card

## SD cards supported on the camera

Following SD cards can be used with the camera. (As of October 2017)

- Operation is not guaranteed for any SD cards other than above.
- It is recommended to use the Panasonic SD card.
- Following SD cards cannot be used since they are not compliant with the SD standards.
- SD card with 4 GB or larger without SDHC logo display
- SD card with 48 GB or larger without SDXC logo display

#### **Speed Class during shooting**

The SD card to be used differs depending on the recording mode and the recording format.

Use the SD card compatible to the Speed Class, UHS Speed Class, or Video Speed Class.

The recording may stop suddenly when the SD card not compatible to required Speed Class is used.

• Speed Class, UHS Speed Class, and Video Speed Class are the speed specification regarding continuous writing. It can be checked at the display on the SD card label, etc.



### Removing the SD card

- 1 Open the card slot cover.
  - Confirm that the card access lamp is not flashing in orange.
  - Data is being written/read when the card access lamp is flashing in orange, so do not remove the SD card.
- 2 Press in the SD card further into the camera and let go.
  - The SD card is released from the card slot, and pull it out straight.
- 3 Close the card slot cover.

### Cautions when using or storing

- Do not touch the terminal section at the rear of the SD card.
- Avoid high temperature and humidity.
- · Avoid water droplets.

· Avoid charging with electricity.

Use or store the SD card with the card inserted into the camera and with the slot cover closed.

- 1 Select the [REC SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [CARDS/MEDIA]  $\rightarrow$  [FORMAT MEDIA]  $\rightarrow$  [SLOT1]/[SLOT2].
- 2 When the confirmation message is displayed, select [SET].
- 3 When the completion message is displayed, select **.**



- · This function can be operated also by touching the LCD monitor.
- · It may take few seconds after closing the completion message until it can record.



The recording data in MOV format is related with the folder structure and the management files as shown in the figure. If these information is changed or deleted even partially, an error such as that the data may not be recognized as the MOV data, or the recording becomes impossible will occur.

AVCHD formatted recording data includes not only video and audio data, but also various important data, and they are related in a folder structure as shown in the figure. If such information is changed or deleted even partially, an error may occur, such as that the data may not be recognized as the AVCHD data, or the SD card may not be used on the AVCHD device.

## NOT.

- Do not erase the folder or file in the SD card with a PC. It may make it impossible to read on the camera.
- An error may occur such as that the SD card will not be recognized or data will not be recorded in the SD card when data is recorded in the SD card by a PC.
- The SD card to be used on the camera should always be formatted on the camera.
- Number of the AVCHD format clips that can be recorded on a single SD card is approximately 3900.
   Data will not be able to record when it reaches the maximum number of data that can be recorded.

### Volume label of the SD card


The value set in the [REC SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [CLIP NAME] is stored in the volume label in CAM INDEX + NEXT REEL COUNT format when the SD is formatted. Once it is stored, [NEXT REEL COUNT] will increase by one. Stored REEL COUNT is also used for the REEL number of the MOV format file name.



• When recorded to the SD card with CAM INDEX+REEL COUNT not recorded in the volume label, the value set in the [REC SETTINGS] menu → [CLIP NAME] is automatically stored in the volume label, and [NEXT REEL COUNT] will increase by one.





## Setting of time data

The camera provides time code, user bits, and date and time (real time) data as time data, and records in each frame synchronized with the video. The time data is also recorded as the clip meta data

### **Definition of time data**

#### ■ Time code

[FREE RUN] and [REC RUN] can be switched with the [REC SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [TC]  $\rightarrow$  [FREE/REC RUN].

- [FREE RUN]: Advances regardless of the operation mode. It is advancing even when the power is turned off, so it can be treated equally as time. It can also be recorded to the time code input to the <TC IN/OUT> terminal using slave lock.
- [REC RUN]: Advances only while recording. Recording is started with the value continuing from the last time code recorded previously.



- The [REC RUN] will not be a continuous value for following cases.
- When deleting recorded clips
- When recording is interrupted due to a malfunction of [REC WARNING], etc. during recording.
- It will be fixed to [FREE RUN] when pre-recording is enabled.
- · It will be fixed to [REC RUN] when the variable frame rate recording function is enabled.
- It will be fixed to [REC RUN] when the interval recording function is enabled.

#### ■ User bits

User bits are built-in. User bits are recorded in the clip. Also, it is output as LTC UB, VITC UB of the SDI signal.

The user setting value, time, date, frame rate information during shooting, or clip name can be selected for recording.

The value at the time when the recording has started is recorded in the user bits of the clip meta data.

#### ■ Duration (clip length) counter

This counter counts from 0 each time recording starts. The duration of the recorded clip is displayed after recording.

#### ■ Date/time (real time)

• The internal clock will be the reference for the measurement of the free run time code while the power is set to < (b > (standby), time of the user bits, and date data. Also, it will be the reference for the file generation time and file name when the clip is recorded.



The display in the VIEW screen and the HOME screen is switched with the [REC SETTINGS] menu → [TC] → [TC/UB/Dur.].

#### User bits settings

Set the user bits to be recorded.

## $\textbf{1} \ \, \text{From the [REC SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \text{[TC]} \rightarrow \text{[UB MODE], select the user bits to be recorded.}$

[FRAME RATE]	Records the frame rate information of the shooting.  Use with this setting when using the frame rate information of the user bits with an editing device such as a PC.  Use this setting to control the recording operation in TYPE1 or TYPE2 method against the Panasonic recorder (AJ-PG50, etc.).

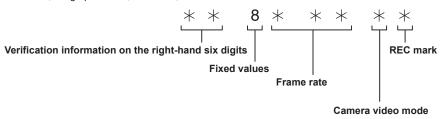

#### Frame rate information

The relationship between frame rate, image pull-down, time code, and user bits is as follows.

- **2** Select the [REC SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [TC]  $\rightarrow$  [DF/NDF]  $\rightarrow$  [DF]/[NDF].

[DF]: Advances the time code in the drop frame mode.

[NDF]: Advances the time code in the non-drop frame mode.

The [SET TC] screen is displayed.

- 4 Set the time code.
- **5** Confirm the setting value of the time code.
  - The setting value is confirmed when last two digits are set.

### ■ Setting range of time code

The range of time code that can be set differs depending on [FREQUENCY].

- The set change is not reflected if the time code setting screen is closed without confirming the setting value.
- Set the number of frames with the value that is multiple of four when [FREQUENCY] is set to 23.98p or 24.00p. The recorded time code will shift with any other value.

### Time code function during battery replacement

The operation of the time code generator will continue by the backup mechanism functioning even when replacing the battery.

The time code of the free run may shift when any item in the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [SYSTEM MODE] is changed. Set the power to < | > (ON) again, confirm the time code, and set it again if necessary.

#### Time code with variable frame rate record

The time code is fixed to [REC RUN] when the variable frame rate recording function is set to enable. The time code will advance in the speed corresponding to the ratio setting values of [FREQUENCY] (system frequency) and [FPS] (frame rate).

As an example, the time frame will advance 60/24 frames (two seconds 12 frames) per second when [FREQUENCY] is set to [24.00p] and [FPS] is set to [60fps].


• The time code output from the <TC IN/OUT> terminal or the <SDI OUT> terminal is advanced in 1x speed from the exact start of recording.

### Presetting the time code to external

The internal time code generator of the camera can be slave locked in a simplified manner to an external generator.

#### Connection example of the camera and an external generator

Connect the reference time come to the <TC IN/OUT> terminal.



#### **External lock**

Externally lock the time code.

- Connect the camera to an external generator in advance.
- 1 Select the [REC SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [TC]  $\rightarrow$  [FREE/REC RUN]  $\rightarrow$  [FREE RUN].
- $\boldsymbol{2}$  Select the [REC SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [TC]  $\rightarrow$  [TC IN/OUT SEL]  $\rightarrow$  [TC IN].
- 3 Enter the external time code to the <TC IN/OUT> terminal.

[TC] in the HOME screen and the VIEW screen will be displayed in black and white inversion. Enter the time code matching the setting in the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [SYSTEM MODE]  $\rightarrow$  [FREQUENCY] as the reference time code. Also, enter the time code of the non-drop frame for 23.98p, 24.00p, 50.00p, and 50.00i.



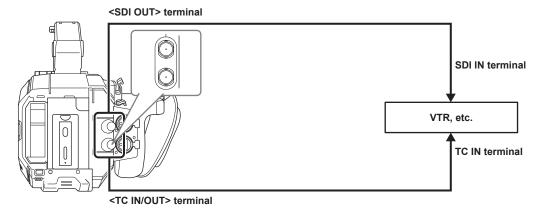
- Do not slave lock to the externally input time code but automatically advance with internal reference during recording or rec remote controlling of the external recording device.
- The time code value may overlap or drop out after recording or ending rec remote due to performing slave lock to the time code input from external.
- Since this camera does not have a genlock system, the time code may shift one frame.
- Once the slave lock is performed, it will maintain the slave lock status even when the input from the <TC IN/OUT> terminal is gone. However, the slave lock status will be cleared in following cases.
- When the time code is set in [SET TC]
- When the power is turned off
- When switched [DF]/[NDF]
- When set to [REC RUN]
- When the variable frame rate recording function is enabled
- The pre-recording will be discarded once when the slave lock is performed during pre-recording.
- The number of frames for the record start time code may not be multiple of four when [FREQUENCY] is set to 23.98p or 24.00p.
- · External locks by user bits are not supported.

## Cautions when switching the power supply from the battery to the AC adaptor while an external lock is active

To maintain the continuity of the time code generator power, remove the battery only after that the power status display in the HOME screen has changed to after connecting the AC adaptor to the <DC IN 12V> terminal. The continuity of the external lock of the time code is not guaranteed when the battery is removed first.

### Supplying the time code externally

The time code output from the camera corresponding to the camera video or the playback video can be supplied to an external recording device.

- TCR is output during playback. TCG output during playback is not supported.

## **Tally lamp**

The front tally lamp and the rear tally lamp can be illuminated during the shooting.

### 1 Select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu $\rightarrow$ [LED & FAN] $\rightarrow$ [TALLY LED] $\rightarrow$ [FRONT]/[REAR]/[BOTH].

- The tally lamp will flash when the camera is in the following status.
  - When the remaining capacity of the SD card or the remaining battery level is low (one time per second)
- The SD card has no more space to record (four times per second)
- When a warning such as a system error or a recording abnormality has occurred (four times per second)



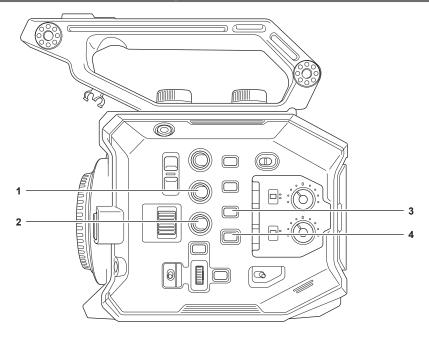
• The tally lamp will not illuminate or flash when the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [LED & FAN]  $\rightarrow$  [TALLY LED]  $\rightarrow$  [OFF] is set.





Displays the status of the audio input for audio channel 1 and the audio channel 2.

[IN1]: The <AUDIO INPUT 1> terminal is selected as the audio input.

[IN2]: The <AUDIO INPUT 2> terminal is selected as the audio input.

[MIC]: An external microphone is selected as the audio input.

[LINE]: An audio device is selected as the audio input.

 $\textbf{[INT(L)]:} \ \ \text{The built-in microphone <L> is selected as the audio input.}$ 

 $\textbf{[INT(R)]:} \ The \ built-in \ microphone < R > is \ selected \ as \ the \ audio \ input.$ 

[48V]: The external microphone power supply is enabled.

#### 6 [WB

Displays the color temperature (white balance).

In case of the preset list acquired by the auto white balance, the color temperature is displayed with [A] at the beginning.

[ATW]: Displays while the auto tracking white balance is operating.

[ATW LOCK]: Displays when the auto tracking white balance is locked.

#### 7 Number of recorded pixels/system frequency

Displays the number of recording pixels and the system frequency.

When the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [SYSTEM MODE]  $\rightarrow$  [SDI RAW] is set to anything other than [OFF], the RAW output resolution and the system frequency from <SDI OUT> terminal are displayed.

#### 8 Pre-recording status display

Displays the re-recording status.

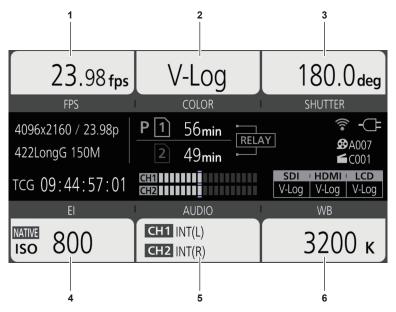



#### [FPS]

**[VFR]:** Enables/disables the variable frame rate recording function.


#### ■ [VFR] display

When the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [FPS]  $\rightarrow$  [VFR SW]  $\rightarrow$  [ON] is set, [VFR] is displayed at the top left of [FPS], and recorded with the frame rate set in [FPS]. Audio cannot be recorded when [FREQUENCY] and [FPS] are different.





The EI screen is displayed when [EI] is selected in the HOME screen, allowing to set EXPOSURE INDEX (gain), and to set the operation in accordance with the setting of the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [EI]  $\rightarrow$  [MODE].




[NATIVE ISO]/[800BASE ISO]/[2500BASE ISO]/[GAIN SELECT]: The VIEW screen is displayed, and EXPOSURE INDEX (gain) can be set.

• Set EXPOSURE INDEX (gain) with  $[\triangle]/[\nabla]$ .

[ISO SELECT]/[GAIN MODE]: The VIEW screen is displayed and the operation in accordance with the setting of the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [EI]  $\rightarrow$  [MODE] can be set.

### [AUDIO]

When [AUDIO] is selected in the HOME screen, the AUDIO screen is displayed, allowing to set the shutter speed.



[CH1 IN]: Sets the audio to be recorded in the audio channel 1.

[CH2 IN]: Sets the audio to be recorded in the audio channel 2.

[INPUT1 SEL]: Sets the audio input signal from the device connected to the <AUDIO INPUT 1> terminal.

[INPUT2 SEL]: Sets the audio input signal from the device connected to the <AUDIO INPUT 2> terminal.

### [WB]

When [WB] is selected in the HOME screen, the VIEW screen is displayed, allowing to set the color temperature (white balance).


- Select from the previously registered white balance setting values in  $[\triangle]/[\nabla]$ .
- The white balance setting value can be added/deleted in the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu → [WHITE] → [ADD]/[DELETE]. Maximum of 12 setting values can be registered.

### INFO screen

Displays the information of the camera.

This is displayed when the <INFO> button is pressed while displaying the HOME screen.

• In addition to operating with the multidial and touch operations, each item can be selected by pressing the <INFO> button.



[DIAGNOSTICS]: Displays the status of the camera, such as warning.

[SWITCHES]: Displays the assignment status of each USER button.

**[VERSION]:** Displays the model name, serial number, and firmware version.

[NETWORK]: Displays the setting value and connection status of the wireless LAN.

[AUDIO]: Displays the audio setting and selection status of each recording channel.

[MEDIA]: Displays the information of the SD card.

## VIEW screen

Displays the shooting screen.

For details of the VIEW screen, refer to "Screen status display".

### Thumbnail screen

Playback, copy, delete, or protect of a clip can be performed.

For details of the thumbnail screen, refer to "Thumbnail operation".

# Basic operation of the menu

The setting of the camera can be changed with the menu in accordance to the shooting scene or recording contents. Set data is written and saved in the camera memory.

• There is a method to operate with the multidial or a grip multidial, or a method to operate by touching the LCD monitor.



### Operating the menu

Operate the multidial on the camera by turning it in vertical direction or pushing it.



- Touch the item to set. A check mark is displayed at the left of the set item.
- To return to one level higher, touch [5].

#### 4 Exit from the menu by touching , or pressing the <MENU> button.

• Depending on the operating item, it will automatically return to the previous screen.

### Handling setting data

### Scene files


### File structure of the setting data

The scene files of [SCENE1] to [SCENE5] can be saved in the camera memory in accordance to the scene file number.

What can be saved as a scene file is the setting contents of the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu.

Also, the current setting value of the scene files [SCENE1] to [SCENE5] can be saved as a file to the camera memory and the SD card, and that data can be read and used in the camera.

Setting data file structure of the camera is as follows.



- \*1 The scene file can be initialized.
  Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu → [SCENE DATA] → [INITIALIZE].
- \*2 Current setting value of each scene file can be individually saved in the camera body. Also, the scene files saved in the camera memory can be read. Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu → [SCENE DATA] → [LOAD]/[SAVE].
- \*3 The scene file can be saved in the SD card in the card slot 1. Also, the scene files saved in the SD card can be read.

### Saving the scene file

#### Saving the scene file into the camera memory

Saves the current setting value of the camera into the camera memory.

**1** Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [SCENE DATA]  $\rightarrow$  [SAVE].

#### Saving the scene file in the SD card

The scene file can be overwritten to a file in the SD card in the card slot 1, or save as a new file.

### ■ Saving the scene file by overwriting a file in the SD card

Overwrites the file selected in the list of the scene files saved in the SD memory card in the card slot 1 with the current setting value of the camera.

### **1** Select the [FILE] menu $\rightarrow$ [SCENE FILE] $\rightarrow$ [SAVE].

The list of scene files saved in the SD card in the card slot 1 is displayed.

### 2 Select the file to overwrite from the list of scene files.

The file name entry screen and the keyboard are displayed. Leave it as is when overwriting.

#### 3 Select [Enter].

A confirmation screen is displayed.

#### 4 Select [SET].

The file is saved.

#### Saving the scene file as a new file in the SD card

Saves the current setting value of the camera into the SD card in the card slot 1 as a new file by specifying the file name.

1 Select the [FILE] menu  $\rightarrow$  [SCENE FILE]  $\rightarrow$  [SAVE AS].

The file name entry screen and the keyboard are displayed.

- 2 Enter the text to set with the keyboard.
- 3 Select [Enter].

A confirmation screen is displayed.

4 Select [SET].

The file is saved.

• An error message may be displayed. For details regarding the error message, refer to "Cases indicated by error messages".

#### Reading the scene file

Reads the scene files saved in the camera memory or the SD card in the card slot 1.

#### Reading the scene file from the camera memory

 $\textbf{1} \hspace{0.1cm} \textbf{Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \textbf{[SCENE DATA]} \rightarrow \textbf{[LOAD]}.$ 

#### Reading the scene file from the SD card

**1** Select the [FILE] menu  $\rightarrow$  [SCENE FILE]  $\rightarrow$  [LOAD].

The list of scene files stored in the specified folder in the SD card in the card slot 1 is displayed.

- 2 Select the file name for the file to read.
- 3 Selects if all of the scene files ([SCENE1] to [SCENE5]) are read, or individually read.
  - To read all, select [ALL].

To read individually, select the scene number to read.

#### 4 Select [SET].

The file is read.

• An error message may be displayed. For details regarding the error message, refer to "Cases indicated by error messages".

#### Initialization of the scene file

- 1 Select the scene file to return to the factory setting in the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [COLOR SETTINGS]  $\rightarrow$  [MAIN].
- $\textbf{2} \ \, \text{Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \text{[SCENE DATA]} \rightarrow \text{[INITIALIZE]}.$

The confirmation screen is displayed.

3 Select [YES].

The selected scene file returns to the factory setting.

#### Changing the scene file name

Changes the name of the scene file.

Only changeable part is the title section of the scene file name. As an example, if the scene file name is [SCENE1 (eV-LOOK1)], only the "eV-LOOK1" part can be changed.

- 1 Select the scene file to change the name in the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [COLOR SETTINGS] → [MAIN].
- 2 Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [NAME EDIT].

The file name entry screen and the keyboard are displayed.

- 3 Enter the text to set with the keyboard. (Maximum eight characters)
- 4 Select [Enter].

The file name is updated.

### Setup file

Specified menu can be saved in the SD card in the card slot 1, or read it into the camera from the SD card.

### Saving the setup file

The setup file can be overwritten to a file in the SD card in the card slot 1, or save as a new file.

#### Saving the setup file by overwriting a file in the SD card

Overwrites the file selected in the list of the setup files saved in the SD memory card with the current setting value of the camera.

 $\textbf{1} \ \, \text{Select the [FILE] menu} \rightarrow \text{[SETUP FILE]} \rightarrow \text{[SAVE]}.$ 

The list of setup files saved in the SD card in the card slot 1 is displayed.

### 2 Select the file to overwrite from the list of setup files.

The file name entry screen and the keyboard are displayed. Leave it as is when overwriting.

### 3 Select [Enter].

A confirmation screen is displayed.

#### 4 Select [SET].

The file is saved.

#### Saving the setup file as a new file in the SD card

Saves the current setting value of the camera into the SD card in the card slot 1 as a new file by specifying the file name.

### $\textbf{1} \ \, \text{Select the [FILE] menu} \rightarrow \text{[SETUP FILE]} \rightarrow \text{[SAVE AS]}.$

The file name entry screen and the keyboard are displayed.

### 2 Enter the text to set with the keyboard.

### 3 Select [Enter].

A confirmation screen is displayed.

#### 4 Select [SET].

The file is saved.

• An error message may be displayed. For details regarding the error message, refer to "Cases indicated by error messages".

#### Reading the setup file

Reads the setup file saved in the SD card in the card slot 1.

### **1** Select the [FILE] menu $\rightarrow$ [SETUP FILE] $\rightarrow$ [LOAD].

The list of setup files stored in the specified folder in the SD card in the card slot 1 is displayed.

### 2 Select the file name for the file to read.

### 3 Select [SET].

Loading of the file is started. The camera is restarted after reading.


- An error message may be displayed. For details regarding the error message, refer to "Cases indicated by error messages".
- The file saved by a camera with different firmware version may not be able to read.

# Chapter 5 Shooting

This chapter describes the basic procedure for recording. This chapter also describes the special recording method.

### **Shooting**

For shooting, use the following steps.



- 1 REC button (camera body)
- 2 REC button (grip)

#### 1 Set the video settings and the audio input.

- Before shooting, the followings must be set or adjusted.
  - Image settings for the brightness function (iris, gain, shutter) and the white balance adjustment function, etc.
  - Audio input settings for audio recording.
  - Adjusting audio recording level

### 2 Start the recording by pressing the REC button.

- There is one REC button each on the camera and the grip.
- The tally lamp is illuminated in red while recording.

### 3 Press the REC button again to stop.

### 4 Check videos recorded.

The last approximately three seconds of the previously shot clip is automatically played back by pressing the USER button with [REC CHECK] assigned.

In this way, you can check whether video has been recorded properly.

• Returns to recording standby after checking.



 When the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [SYSTEM MODE] → [SDI RAW] is set to anything other than [OFF], recording to an SD card with the camera is not possible.

### Selecting the resolution, codec, and frame rate for recording video

The resolution, codec, and frame rate of the recording video can be selected in the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [SYSTEM MODE].

- [FREQUENCY]: System frequency
- [SDI RAW]: Resolution (RAW output resolution from the <SDI OUT> terminal)

When [SDI RAW] is set to anything other than [OFF], [SENSOR MODE], [MAIN PIXEL], and [MAIN CODEC] cannot be set.

### Image quality adjustment

The image quality of the video to be recorded can be adjusted in the camera when the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [COLOR SETTINGS]  $\rightarrow$  [MAIN]  $\rightarrow$  [SCENE1] to [SCENE5] is set.

- Adjust the image quality in the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu.
- The [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu cannot be set when [MAIN] is set to [V-Log].
- It is necessary to use a measuring device such as vector scope to change the setting.

#### [EI]

Sets the sensitivity of the video.

#### **Dual native ISO**

The camera is equipped with dual native ISO, [800 ISO] and [2500 ISO], and two [NATIVE ISO].

By installing the sensitivity switching circuit inside the image sensor, a high sensitivity and low noise [2500 ISO] is realized.

The latitude will decrease according to the value when ISO range lower than [NATIVE ISO] is used.

#### [dB]

There are two gain modes of [NORMAL] and [HIGH]. The standard sensitivity equivalent to [NATIVE ISO] is set as 0 dB.

When the gamma curve is [VIDEO], the dynamic range will be 600%, which is lower than [V-Log] or other gamma curve. Therefore, the standard sensitivity will be lower than [V-Log] or other gamma curve.

#### [WHITE]

### [ATW] (auto tracking white balance)

The camera is equipped with the auto tracking white balance (ATW) function that automatically tracks the white balance of images according to the lighting condition.

This function does not guarantee 100% accuracy for the white balance. There is some range in the tracking against the change in the lighting condition or accuracy in the white balance. Take care when using this function.


#### [AWB] (auto white balance)

- 1 Place a white pattern in a point where the light condition matches the light source for the subject, and display white in the screen.
- 2 Adjust the luminance with the <IRIS> dial.
- **3** Select the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [WHITE]  $\rightarrow$  [VALUE]  $\rightarrow$  [AWB MEMORY].
- **4** Select the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu → [WHITE] → [AWB] → [EXECUTE].
  - It will operate the same by pressing the USER button assigned with [AWB] (auto white balance).

#### Adjustment value

- The adjusted value is automatically recorded in [AWB MEMORY].
- White pattern
- A white object (cloth or wall) near the subject may also be used for the white pattern.

• Required size of white pattern is as follows.



- · Keep bright spotlights out of the screen.
- The white pattern must be placed at the center of the screen.

#### Manually setting the color temperature (setting with [VALUE])

Can be selected from the up to 12 registered color temperatures (white balance).

- 1 Select the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [WHITE]  $\rightarrow$  [VALUE].
- 2 Select the color temperature.

### [BLACK]

#### [ABB] (auto black balance)

Adjust the auto black balance in following cases.

- When the camera is used for the first time
- When it has past extensive time after used previously
- When the ambient temperature has changed extensively after used previously
- 1 Mount the cap on the lens.
  - Make sure the light does not get to the image sensor.
- **2** Select the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [AUTO BLACK BALANCE]  $\rightarrow$  [ABB]  $\rightarrow$  [EXECUTE].
  - Do not remove the lens cap or set the power to < 🖒 > (standby) while [ABB ACTIVE] is displayed on the LCD monitor.

#### Pedestal (standard black level)

**1** Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [BLACK]  $\rightarrow$  [M.PED]/[R PED]/[G PED]/[B PED].

[M.PED] (master pedestal): Adjusts the reference black level of the whole video. The adjusted value is maintained even when the auto black balance is executed.


[R PED] (red signal pedestal), [G PED] (green signal pedestal), [B PED] (blue signal pedestal): Adjusts the reference black level for each signal. Depending on the setting in the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [BLACK]  $\rightarrow$  [PEDESTAL OFFSET], it can be set if the adjusted value is to be maintained or not when the auto black balance is executed.




### [GAMMA SELECT]

Set to optimize the tone of video.

The items that can be selected differ depending on the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [COLOR SETTINGS]  $\rightarrow$  [MAIN] setting.







• [V-Log]

This is a gamma curve that can achieve gradation and wide latitude (exposure range). A grading process after recording is required.

• [V-255570L1]

This is the EVA-LOOK gamma curve with 14Stop latitude equivalent to [V-Log].

The rise is equivalent to approximately 2.5 times, and the gamma factor is 0.55, which means up to 70%.

This is a setting focused on contrast.

It is recommended to shoot at 40% to 55% for face tone.

• [V-504580L1]

This is the EVA-LOOK gamma curve with 14Stop latitude equivalent to [V-Log].

The rise is equivalent to approximately 5.0 times, and the gamma factor is 0.45, which means up to 80%.

This is a setting focused on soft texture.

It is recommended to shoot at 40% to 60% for face tone.

• [VIDEO]

This is the BroadCast-LOOK gamma curve with 600% dynamic range equivalent to the generally used video camera.

• [HLG]

this is the hybrid log gamma curve with wide dynamic range of 1200%.

The color range equivalent to BT.2020 is automatically set.

#### ■ When [MAIN] is set to [V-Log]

[GAMMA] will be set to [V-Log].

- When [MAIN] is set to [SCENE1]/[SCENE2]/[SCENE3]/[SCENE4]/[SCENE5]
- **1** Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [GAMMA]  $\rightarrow$  [GAMMA SELECT].
- 2 Select one from [V-255570L1]/[V-504580L1]/[VIDEO]/[HLG].

#### [MASTER GAMMA]

This can be set when the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [GAMMA]  $\rightarrow$  [GAMMA SELECT]  $\rightarrow$  [VIDEO] is selected. Fine adjusts the entire gamma curve.

#### [BLACK GAMMA]

This can be set when the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu → [GAMMA] → [GAMMA SELECT] → [VIDEO]/[HLG] is selected.

#### **■** [BLACK GAMMA]

Sets the gamma curve compression and expansion of dark area.

Dark area is compressed in the negative side, and expanded in positive side.


#### ■ [B.GAMMA RANGE]

Sets the maximum of compression and expansion in [BLACK GAMMA].

#### [KNEE]

This function sets the compression of video signals to prevent halation in images.

The dynamic range and compression rate of the video signal change depending on the setting.

#### [KNEE MODE] (setting for knee operation mode)

- 1 Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [KNEE]  $\rightarrow$  [KNEE SW]  $\rightarrow$  [ON].
- $\textbf{2} \; \text{Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \text{[KNEE]} \rightarrow \text{[KNEE MODE]} \rightarrow \text{[D RANGE]/[PRESS]}.$

[D RANGE]: Determines the dynamic range that can be represented by the [KNEE SLOPE] value. The value of dynamic range that can be represented does not change even when the value of [KNEE POINT] changes.

[PRESS]: Determines the signal compression rate by the [KNEE SLOPE] value. The value of the dynamic range that can be represented changes when the [KNEE POINT] value changes.

- [KNEE POINT] (knee point position setting)


Sets to compress the video signal to prevent the halation in the image during HLG.

#### [WHITE CLIP]

Sets so the brightest part of the video signal does not get higher than a specific level.

- 2 From the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [WHITE CLIP]  $\rightarrow$  [LEVEL], set the level.

### [DETAIL]

Sets the intensity of the outline to represent the image.

It can have soft representation or sharp representation, but then again, it can also have an effect to roughen the entire video by enhancing the noise or edge.

To prevent the whole image to become rough, adjust so that the detail effect will remain in the area to enhance the detail, but to hold back the detail effect in the area that does not require enhancement.

- **1** Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [DETAIL]  $\rightarrow$  [SW]  $\rightarrow$  [ON].
- f 2 Set the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu ightarrow [DETAIL] ightarrow [CORING]/[MASTER LEVEL]/[FREQUENCY].

[CORING]: Sets the level of signal (including noise) not to activate the detail effect.

[MASTER LEVEL]: Sets the level of the detail effect of the whole part.

[FREQUENCY]: Sets the thickness of the detail as a whole.

### [SKIN DETAIL]

A function to make human skin look smoother.

- $\label{eq:scene} \textbf{1} \ \ \text{Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \text{[SKIN DETAIL]}.$
- 2 Set one of [SKIN DTL1]/[SKIN DTL2]/[SKIN DTL3] to [ON]. [SKIN DTL1]/[SKIN DTL2]/[SKIN DTL3] can be used in conjunction.

### [CHROMA]

Sets the color saturation.

 $\textbf{1} \ \, \textbf{Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \textbf{[CHROMA]} \rightarrow \textbf{[LEVEL]}.$ 

Sets the chroma level of  $P_R$  and  $P_B$  signals. The distance from the center (no color) is increased or decreased for the entire image when the vector scope is used.






• The bold line in the figure is the reference line for each axis of matrix. The color above the bold line does not change.















### [COLOR CORRECTION]

This function sets color saturation and phase.

This affects individually against the 16 phases of the image.

It can be set to individual color hue.



- R: Red P1: (YI-R)-R P2: (YI-R) YI-(YI-R) Yellow (G-YI)-YI (G-YI) P5: G: Green (Cy-G) Cy: Cyan P7: (B-Cy) B: Blue (Mg-B) Mg: Magenta P9: (R-Mg) P10: R-(R-Mg)
- $\textbf{1} \ \ \text{Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \text{[COLOR CORRECTION]} \rightarrow \text{[SW]} \rightarrow \text{[ON]}.$
- $\textbf{2} \ \, \text{Select the [SCENE FILE SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \text{[COLOR CORRECTION]} \rightarrow \text{[PARAM]}, \text{ and set the color saturation and hue for each item.}$

### Variable frame rate (VFR) recording function

It is possible to acquire smooth slow motion or quick motion vide by shooting with a different frame rate from the frame rate to play back.

#### Variable frame rate (VFR)

Allows the high-speed shooting from 1fps to maximum of 240fps.

# 1 From the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [SYSTEM MODE] → [SENSOR MODE], select the resolution and codec of the recording video, and the frequency that will become the reference frame rate.

- For the combination that can be set, refer to "Selecting the resolution, codec, and frame rate for recording video".
- The range of the frame rate that can perform high-speed shooting differs depending on the [SENSOR MODE] setting.
- When the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [SYSTEM MODE] → [SDI RAW] is set to anything other than [OFF], the range of frame rate that can
  perform high-speed shooting changes depending on the [SDI RAW] setting.

For the combination that can be set, refer to "Selecting the resolution and frame rate of the RAW output".

### ${f 2}$ Select the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu ightarrow [FPS] ightarrow [VFR SW] ightarrow [ON].

• This can also be set with the multidial. Refer to "Functions assigned to USER buttons".

### f 3 From the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu o [FPS] o [VALUE], set the frame rate in accordance with the shooting condition.

- This can also be set with the multidial. Refer to "Functions assigned to USER buttons".
- An arbitrary frame rate can be added/changed/deleted in the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu → [FPS] → [ADD]/[EDIT]/[DELETE].

#### 4 Press the REC button.

Variable frame rate recording is started.

#### Normal shooting mode

The 4K/UHD video is generated using all the pixels in the image sensor.

2K/FHD video is also generated from that video.

The high-speed shooting up to 60fps is possible.

Select [S35 5.7K] for [SENSOR MODE].

#### ■ Pixel mixing shooting mode

The 2.8K pixel mixing read is performed from all the pixels of the image sensor, and generates the 2K/FHD video.

The high-speed shooting up to 120fps is possible.

Select [S35 MIX 2.8K] for [SENSOR MODE].

• The angle of view is the same as the normal shooting mode.

#### ■ Cut-out shooting mode

Cuts out the image circle of Four Thirds from the center of the image sensor, and performs the pixel mixing read of 2.2K. 2K/FHD video is also generated from that video.

The high-speed shooting up to 240fps is possible.

Select [4/3 CROP&MIX 2.2K] for [SENSOR MODE].

• The angle of view will change from the normal shooting mode.



- Recording of audio is not possible with the variable frame rate shooting. However, audio is recorded when the frame rate is set to same as the system frequency.
- The screen may be disrupted or become dark when the frame rate setting is changed.
- The frame rate cannot be changed while recording.
- The [REC SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [TC]  $\rightarrow$  [FREE/REC RUN] is fixed to [REC RUN].
- The recording is paused when ten hours has past from the time the recording was started. The recording is automatically resumed after few seconds. When performing a high-speed shooting, the recording time will be shorter than 10 hours depending on the ratio of the frame rate of the recording format and the variable frame rate. The recording will stop in 5 hours when [FREQUENCY] is set to [24.00p], and [FPS] is set to [48fps].
- For recording limitation during the variable frame rate shooting, refer to "Recording function that cannot be used simultaneously".
- It may take time to stop recording even if recording is stopped right after recording is started.


When [FREQUENCY] is set to [59.94p] and [FPS] is set to [1fps], recording is continued for maximum of one minute until the length of the clip after shooting becomes one second.

### **Special recording function**

Special recording such as pre-recording or relay recording is possible by setting the menu.

#### Pre-recording

Records the video and audio from specific time before the operation to start the recording.



The pre-recording time varies depending on the setting of the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [SYSTEM MODE]  $\rightarrow$  [MAIN PIXEL]/[MAIN CODEC].

- When [MAIN PIXEL] is set to [1280x720], [1920x1080], or [2048x1080]: Approximately ten seconds.
- When [MAIN CODEC] is set to [422ALL-I 400M]: Approximately three seconds.
- Other than above: Approximately five seconds.

### 1 Select the [REC SETTINGS] menu $\rightarrow$ [PRE REC] $\rightarrow$ [ON].

[P] is displayed in the pre-recording status display of the VIEW and HOME screens.


### 2 Press the REC button.



- The video and audio may not be able to record for specific time before in following cases.
- Immediately after the power is set to < > (ON)
- Right after opening the menu
- Immediately after the SD card is inserted
- Right after playing back the recorded video
- Immediately after closing the thumbnail screen
- Until the writing to the SD card is completed after stopping the recording
- Immediately after slave locking to an external time code
- Immediately after switching the card slot to record by pressing the USER button with [SLOT SEL] assigned
- When [PRE REC] is set to [ON], the [REC SETTINGS] menu → [TC] → [FREE/REC RUN] is fixed to [FREE RUN].
- The pre-recording is cancelled once when three hours has past without starting the recording.
- ${}^{\textstyle \bullet} \text{ For recording limitation of the pre-recording, refer to "Recording function that cannot be used simultaneously"}.$
- ${}^{ullet}$  Pre-recording cannot be performed if the remaining capacity of the SD card is less than one minute.

#### Relay recording

Two SD cards can be inserted into the two card slots, and recording can continue on the second SD card when the remaining recordable capacity of the other SD card is exhausted.



- 1 During recording
- 2 Automatically switch the recording target card slot
- 3 Replace with a different recordable SD card

#### 1 Select the [REC SETTINGS] menu $\rightarrow$ [2 SLOTS FUNC.] $\rightarrow$ [RELAY REC].

[RELAY] is displayed in the special recording function display of the HOME screen.

A slanted line is displayed on the [RELAY] display when the relay recording is not possible, such as the SD card is not inserted in either of the two card slots.

### 2 Press the REC button.

The recording status of the recording target card slot in the VIEW screen is displayed black and white inverted.

- When remaining recordable capacity of one of the SD card is exhausted and the relay recording is started, the recording target will switch to the other SD card. The recording status of the card slot that became the recording target is displayed black and white inverted. It can record to three or more SD card. Replace the SD card with no more remaining recordable capacity after the recording target has switched.
- To change the recording target card slot before starting the recording, press the <SLOT SEL> button. This will not operate during recording.




- It may take some time to recognize the SD card when the SD card is inserted. When recording to three or more SD cards by replacing them while recording, replace them while there are sufficient remaining recordable capacity on the SD card that is recording.
- · Switching of the recording target cannot be performed when the remaining recordable capacity of the relaying SD card is less than one minute.
- The maximum continuous recording time for relay recording is ten hours.

- The recording is stopped once when the recording time of relay recording exceeds ten hours. The recording is automatically resumed after few seconds.
- · For recording limitation of the relay recording, refer to "Recording function that cannot be used simultaneously".

#### Simultaneous recording

Insert SD cards into two card slots, and record the same video onto two SD cards.



### 1 Select the [REC SETTINGS] menu $\rightarrow$ [2 SLOTS FUNC.] $\rightarrow$ [SIMUL REC].

[SIMUL] is displayed in the special recording function display of the HOME screen.

A slanted line is displayed on the [SIMUL] display when the simultaneous recording is not possible, such as the SD card is not inserted in either of the two card slots.

#### 2 Press the REC button.

[SIMUL] is displayed in the two slot function display of the VIEW screen.


- The simultaneous recording will stop when remaining recordable capacity of one of the SD card is exhausted.
  - A diagonal line is displayed in the [SIMUL] display when simultaneous recording is not possible.
  - To start the simultaneous recording again, replace the SD card that has ran out of the remaining recordable capacity with another SD card, and press the REC button.
- When the REC button is pressed without replacing the SD card, a standard recording to the SD card with remaining recordable capacity will be performed.



- It is recommended to use the SD cards with the same Speed Class or capacity for simultaneous recording.
- The recording may stop due to insufficient speed when SD cards with different Speed Classes or capacities are used. If the recording is stopped, the video right before stopping may become invalid recording.
- Start the recording after both two SD cards are recognized. When the recording is started before both SD cards are recognized, it will perform standard recording on one of the SD card that was recognized. The camera confirms the status of the SD card every time the recording is completed. If both cards are recognized at that time, it will perform the simultaneous recording from the next recording.
- When recording in one of the SD card is stopped with a recording error during the simultaneous recording, the recording to the other SD card will
  continue.
- If there is remaining recordable capacity on one of the SD card after completing the simultaneous recording, the SD card with remaining recordable capacity will automatically become the recording target. Standard recording will start when the REC button is pressed.
- If only one SD card is inserted even if it is set to simultaneous recording, it will perform standard recording.
- · Once the simultaneous recording is completed, [DEL LAST CLIP] (final clip delete function) assigned to the USER button will not operate.
- For the folder name and the file name when performing simultaneous recording in MOV format, refer to "Handling of the recording data".
- · For recording limitation of the simultaneous recording, refer to "Recording function that cannot be used simultaneously".

#### Interval recording

The camera will record one frame at each set time interval.



### **1** Select the [REC SETTINGS] menu $\rightarrow$ [REC FUNCTION] $\rightarrow$ [REC MODE] $\rightarrow$ [INTERVAL].

[INTRVL] is displayed in the special recording function display of the VIEW screen and the HOME screen.

- When the recording mode is set to AVCHD, or when the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [SYSTEM MODE] → [FREQUENCY] is set to [50.00i]/ [59.94i], this cannot be selected.
- **2** From the [REC SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [REC FUNCTION]  $\rightarrow$  [INTERVAL TIME], set the time.

### 3 Press the REC button.

- [I-REC] is displayed in red in the special recording function display of the VIEW screen.
- The camera will repeat the operation of one frame recording at set time interval.
- To stop recording, press the REC button.

#### Chapter 5 Shooting — Special recording function

- $\bullet \text{ To clear the setting, set the [REC SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow [REC FUNCTION] \rightarrow [REC MODE] \text{ to [NORMAL]}.$
- The setting is not cleared even when the power is turned off.



- · Audio is not recorded.
- · Recorded data (data recorded until recording was stopped) is included in one clip.
- The [REC SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [TC]  $\rightarrow$  [FREE/REC RUN] is fixed to [REC RUN].
- The [REC SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [TC]  $\rightarrow$  [DF/NDF] is fixed to [NDF].
- [SDI REC REMOTE] and [HDMI REC REMOTE] will not operate.
- If the length of the clip is less than three seconds when the recording is stopped, the image of the final frame will be recorded to make the length of the clip to three seconds.
- The recording is stopped once when the length of the clip exceeds ten hours in the interval recording. The recording is automatically resumed after few seconds.
- · For recording limitation of the interval recording, refer to "Recording function that cannot be used simultaneously".

#### IR shooting

A night time shooting using the IR light can be performed.

- Assigning [IR SHOOTING] to the USER button
- 1 Select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [USER SWITCHES] → [USER1] to [USER9] → [IR SHOOTING].
  Set so enable/disable of the IR shooting can be switched with an arbitrary USER button.
- Performing IR shooting
- 1 Press the USER button that [IR SHOOTING] is assigned.

The camera will enter the IR shooting mode.

2 Press the REC button.

IR shooting is started.



• It can also be set with the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [IR SHOOTING].

### Convenient shooting functions

### Zebra patterns display

The camera can display two types of zebra patterns to the output image from the <LCD> terminal.

#### **1** Select the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu $\rightarrow$ [LCD EI ASSIST] $\rightarrow$ [ZEBRA] $\rightarrow$ [ON].

• Factory setting: [OFF]


#### Setting the detection level

### 1 Set the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu $\rightarrow$ [LCD EI ASSIST] $\rightarrow$ each item.

Item	Description of settings
[ZEBRA1 DETECT]	Sets the detection level of zebra pattern 1. [0%][109%] (Factory setting: [80%])
[ZEBRA2 DETECT]	Sets the detection level of zebra pattern 2. [0%][109%] (Factory setting: [100%])
[ZEBRA2]	Enables/disables zebra pattern 2 and selects [SPOT]. [ON], [SPOT], [OFF] (Factory setting: [OFF])

#### ■ Display area of the zebra pattern

The display area of the zebra pattern varies depending on the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [LCD EI ASSIST] setting. When [SPOT] is selected in [ZEBRA2], the area corresponding to the [ZEBRA1 DETECT] setting value to the [ZEBRA2 DETECT] setting value is displayed in zebra pattern.





- The zebra pattern cannot be recorded.
- When the focus square display of the focus assist function is enabled, the zebra pattern is not displayed while displaying the color bars.

### Displaying the center marker

A center marker can be displayed.

### $\textbf{1} \ \, \text{From the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \text{[LCD MARKER]} \rightarrow \text{[CENTER MARKER]}, \, \text{select the type of the center marker} \, .$

• The center marker is not displayed when [OFF] is selected.



### Displaying the safety zone marker

A safety zone marker can be displayed.

#### 1 From the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu → [LCD MARKER] → [SAFETY MARKER], select the type of frame.

• The safety zone marker is not displayed when [OFF] is selected.

#### Setting the size of the frame.

1 Select the size of the frame in the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [LCD MARKER]  $\rightarrow$  [SAFETY AREA].

### Displaying frame marker

A frame marker can be displayed.

**1** From the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [LCD MARKER]  $\rightarrow$  [FRAME MARKER], select the angle of view.

• The frame marker is not displayed when [OFF] is selected.

#### Setting the display color

 $\textbf{1} \ \, \text{From the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \text{[LCD MARKER]} \rightarrow \text{[FRAME COLOR]}, \, \text{select the display color}.$ 




- · The marker cannot be recorded.
- When the enlarged display function and the focus square display of the focus assist function is enabled and while displaying the color bars, the marker is not displayed.
- · Displays/hides of the marker can be temporarily switched by pressing the USER button with [LCD MARKER] assigned.
- The marker can be displayed in the output image from the <SDI OUT> terminal by setting in the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu → [SDI OUT] → [MARKER DISP] → [ON], and setting [SDI/HDMI MARKER]. Similarly, the marker can be displayed in the output image of the <HDMI> terminal by setting the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu → [HDMI OUT] → [MARKER DISP] → [ON].

### One-push auto focus function

The one-push auto focus function is a function to automatically adjust the focus.

The focus area is 1/3 of the screen height and 1/4 of the width.



#### ■ Assign [ONE PUSH AF] to the USER button

Assign the one-push auto focus function so that it can be used with an arbitrary USER button.

- **1** Select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [USER SWITCHES]  $\rightarrow$  [USER1] to [USER9]  $\rightarrow$  [ONE PUSH AF].
  - [ONE PUSH AF] is assigned to the <USER 1> button as a factory setting.
- Using the one-push auto focus function
- 1 Set the focus switch on the lens to AF.
- 2 Press the USER button to which [ONE PUSH AF] is assigned.



The one-push auto focus function operates only when a lens compatible with the auto focus is mounted.

#### Focus assist function

The focus assist function enables you to focus the target easily.

The recording image on the LCD monitor can be displayed enlarged, or the focused area can be visually enhanced.

It is also possible to make the focusing easier by changing the aperture of the iris to decrease the depth of field.

The focus assist function is displayed only on the LCD monitor.

#### **Enlarged display function**

Center of the recording image is displayed enlarged to make it easier to focus.

#### ■ Assigning [EXPAND] to the USER button

Set so enable/disable of the enlarged display function can be switched with an arbitrary USER button.

**1** Select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [USER SWITCHES]  $\rightarrow$  [USER1] to [USER9]  $\rightarrow$  [EXPAND].

• [EXPAND] is assigned to the <USER 8> button as a factory setting.

#### Using the enlarged display function

#### 1 Press the USER button that [EXPAND] is assigned.

Press the USER button again to return to the normal display.

#### Setting the mode for enlarged display function

#### 1 Select the mode for enlarged display function in the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu → [LCD FOCUS ASSIST] → [EXPAND MODE].

[10SEC]: Disables the enlarged display function after ten seconds have elapsed.


[HOLD]: The enlarged display function is enabled until the USER button assigned with [EXPAND] is pressed again.

[UNTIL REC]: Enables the enlarged display function until starting the recording operation.

#### Setting the enlargement rate

#### 1 From the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu → [LCD FOCUS ASSIST] → [EXPAND VALUE], select the enlargement rate.

• The enlargement rate can be selected from [x2], [x3], or [x4].



#### Setting the enlargement position

The enlargement position can be selected from nine positions when the enlarged display function is enabled.

In case of the multidial or grip multidial: The enlarged position will move every time the multidial is turned. It will return to center when the multidial is pressed.

In case of touching the LCD monitor: The enlarged position will move by touching the vertical and horizontal arrow markers on the LCD monitor.



- · The enlarged display cannot be recorded.
- It will not perform enlarged display while displaying the color bars.
- · Some of the displays such as marker will be hidden temporarily during enlarged display.

#### Peaking display/focus square display

The peaking display will outline the contour of the focused image in red, green, or white.

The focus square display will display the degree of how focused with the size of a square.

#### ■ Assigning [PEAK./SQUARES F.A.] to the USER button

Set this function so that the peaking display and the focus square display can be enabled/disabled with an arbitrary USER button.

#### 1 Select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [USER SWITCHES] → [USER1] to [USER9] → [PEAK./SQUARES F.A.].

- [PEAK./SQUARES F.A.] is assigned to the <USER 2> button as a factory setting.
- Displaying peaking display/focus square display

### 1 Press the USER button that [PEAK./SQUARES F.A.] is assigned.

Press the USER button again to return to the normal display.

When the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu → [LCD FOCUS ASSIST] → [PEAK./SQUARES MODE] → [PEAK./SQUARES] is set, the display will
switch every time the USER button is pressed.

#### Setting the peaking display/focus square display

#### 1 From the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu → [LCD FOCUS ASSIST] → [PEAK./SQUARES MODE], select the type of display.

[PEAKING]: Enables the peaking display.

[SQUARES]: Enables the focus square display.

[PEAK./SQUARES]: Enables peaking display and the focus square display. It will switch in the order of peaking display, focus square display, and no display every time the USER button with [PEAK./SQUARES F.A.] assigned is pressed.

#### Setting the peaking level

Sets the intensity of the peaking display.

#### f 1 From the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu o [LCD FOCUS ASSIST] o [PEAKING LEVEL], select the intensity of the peaking display.

• The intensity of the peaking display can be selected from [LOW], [MID], or [HIGH].

#### Setting the color for peaking display


Sets the color of the peaking display.

### f 1 From the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu ightarrow [LCD FOCUS ASSIST] ightarrow [PEAKING COLOR], select the color of the peaking display.

• The color of the peaking display can be selected from [RED], [GREEN], or [WHITE].

#### How to view the focus square display

Adjust the focus so that the square size displayed in the area of the subject to be focused becomes the largest.



When focused on the doll

When the panel is focused



- The peaking display/focus square display cannot be recorded.
- · The peaking display/focus square display is not displayed while displaying the color bars.
- · Some of the displays such as marker will be hidden temporarily during displaying the focus square function.

#### Monochrome display

 $\textbf{1} \; \; \text{Select the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \text{[LCD FOCUS ASSIST]} \rightarrow \text{[BLACK \& WHITE]} \rightarrow \text{[ON]}.$ 



The monochrome display can be enabled while the peaking display and the focus square display is operating.
 Select the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu → [LCD FOCUS ASSIST] → [BLACK & WHITE] → [DURING PEAK./SQUARES].

#### Open iris focus assist function

This is a function to make focusing easier by decreasing the depth of field by opening the iris. At the same time, the brightness is kept constant by operating the shutter function.

The aperture is adjusted automatically.

#### ■ Assigning [OPEN IRIS F.A.] to the USER button

Assign the open iris focus function so that it can be used with an arbitrary USER button.

- 1 Select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [USER SWITCHES]  $\rightarrow$  [USER1] to [USER9]  $\rightarrow$  [OPEN IRIS F.A.].
  - [OPEN IRIS F.A.] is assigned to the <USER 9> button as a factory setting.
- Using the open iris focus assist function
- 1 Press the USER button that [OPEN IRIS F.A.] is assigned.
  - Press the USER button again to return to the normal display.

#### Setting the operation time

- 1 From the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu → [LCD FOCUS ASSIST] → [OPEN IRIS MODE], select the operation time.
  - The operation time can be selected from [10SEC] or [30SEC].
  - the open iris focus assist function is automatically cancelled when the set time has elapsed.
  - The open iris focus assist function is forced to cancel when the recording is started. Image during the cancel may be included around the beginning
    of the recorded video.

#### **Electronic image stabilization function**

Shaking of the camera can be reduced by using the electronic image stabilization function when shooting by hand-holding the camera.

#### Enabling/disabling the electronic image stabilization function

#### 1 Press the <E.I.S.> button.

**E.I.S** is displayed in the LCD monitor when the electronic image stabilization is enabled.

• Natural image can be acquired by disabling the electronic image stabilization function when using a tripod.

## NOTE

- This function will not operate if set to [4/3 CROP&MIX 2.2K] in the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [SYSTEM MODE] → [SENSOR MODE].
- When the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [FPS]  $\rightarrow$  [VFR SW] is set to [ON], and under the low frame rate setting of 24fps or lower, the effect of image stabilization becomes weaker as the frame rate goes lower.
- · This function will not operate when [D.ZOOM] assigned to the USER button is operating.
- · The electronic image stabilization of the camera will not operate when the optical image stabilization on the lens is operating.
- The effect of the correction disappears with the EF lens that the focal distance is out of 8 mm to 200 mm range.
- When the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu → [E.I.S.] → [ZOOM POSITION DATA] → [AUTO] is set, an EF lens supporting the acquisition of the focal
  distance with the communication between the camera and the lens is required.
- The electronic image stabilization will not operate properly when the [CAMERA SETTINGS] menu → [E.I.S.] → [ZOOM POSITION DATA] → [MANUAL] is set, and the distance that is different from the focal distance of the EF is set in [ZOOM POSITION VALUE].
- This does not operate when the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [SYSTEM MODE] → [SDI RAW] is set to anything other than [OFF].

### **Waveform monitor function**

Waveform of the image can be displayed.

#### ■ Assigning [WFM] to the USER button

Set this function so that the waveform monitor can be displayed/hidden with an arbitrary USER button.

- Select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [USER SWITCHES]  $\rightarrow$  [USER1] to [USER9]  $\rightarrow$  [WFM].
  - [WFM] is assigned to the <USER 5> button as a factory setting.
- Displaying the waveform monitor
- 1 Press the USER button that [WFM] is assigned.

Press the USER button again to return to the normal display.

• The display is switched every time the USER button is pressed when the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu → [LCD EI ASSIST] → [WFM MODE] → [WAVE/VECTOR] is set.

#### Setting the displaying of the waveform monitor

Displaying of the waveform and the vector can be switched.

1 From the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu → [LCD EI ASSIST] → [WFM MODE], select the displaying of waveform monitor.

[WAVE]: Displays the waveform.

[VECTOR]: Displays the vector.

[WAVE/VECTOR]: Displays the waveform and the vector. It will switch in the order of waveform, vector, and no display every time the USER button with [WFM] assigned is pressed.

- The waveform monitor is displayed only on the LCD monitor.
- Display position of the waveform monitor is bottom right of the LCD monitor.

#### Setting the transmittance

The transmittance of the waveform monitor can be set.

- 1 From the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [LCD EI ASSIST]  $\rightarrow$  [WFM TRANSPARENCE], select the transmittance.
  - The transmittance can be selected from [0%], [25%], or [50%].



- · The waveform monitor cannot be recorded.
- This is not displayed during enlarged display and focus square of the focus assist function are displayed.
- The waveform monitor is automatically displayed when setting some of the menu to perform the image quality adjustment.


#### **Digital zoom function**

■ Assigning [D.ZOOM] to the USER button

Set so enable/disable of the digital zoom function can be switched with an arbitrary USER button.

- 1 Select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [USER SWITCHES]  $\rightarrow$  [USER1] to [USER9]  $\rightarrow$  [D.ZOOM].
- Using the digital zoom function
- 1 Press the USER button that [D.ZOOM] is assigned.

Press the USER button again to return to the normal display.





- The enlargement rate is fixed to 1.4 times.
- This can achieve high quality image compared to the common digital zoom function using the pixel interpolation since it is using the 4K pixels at the center of the 5.7K sensor.
- This will not operate if set to [4/3 CROP&MIX 2.2K] in the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [SYSTEM MODE] → [SENSOR MODE].
- This does not operate when the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [SYSTEM MODE] → [SDI RAW] is set to anything other than [OFF].

### Level gauge

A level gauge that indicates the horizontal and vertical inclinations of the camera can be displayed on the LCD monitor.

The line of the level gauge is displayed in orange while the camera is inclined. The line of the level gauge will change from orange to light blue, and then to white when the inclination of the camera is corrected. It will indicate up to approximately 30° in horizontal direction, and 30° in vertical direction.

1 Select the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [LCD LEVEL GAUGE]  $\rightarrow$  [LEVEL GAUGE]  $\rightarrow$  [ON].



- · The display of level gauge cannot be recorded.
- The level gauge is not displayed when the enlarged display function of the focus assist function is enabled, or when displaying the color bars.
- · The level gauge may not display correctly while moving the camera.
- · The level gauge may not display correctly when shooting with the camera inclined excessively upward or downward.
- · Displays/hides of the level gauge can be switched by pressing the USER button assigned with [LEVEL GAUGE].
- Current horizontal and vertical direction can be set as the reference value of the level gauge by pressing the USER button assigned with [LEVEL GAUGE RESET]. To restore the set value, set with the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu → [LCD LEVEL GAUGE] → [LEVEL GAUGE RESET].

#### Color bars

Color bars can be displayed. This is useful for image quality adjustment of a TV or an external monitor.

### ■ Assigning [COLOR BARS] to the USER button

Set this function so that the color bars can be displayed/hidden with an arbitrary USER button.

- **1** Select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [USER SWITCHES]  $\rightarrow$  [USER1] to [USER9]  $\rightarrow$  [COLOR BARS].
  - [COLOR BARS] is assigned to the <USER 5> button as a factory setting.
- Displaying the color bars
- 1 Press the USER button that [COLOR BARS] is assigned.

Press the USER button again to return to the normal display.



This does not operate when the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [SYSTEM MODE] → [SDI RAW] is set to anything other than [OFF].

#### Setting the type of color bars

- **1** From the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [COLOR BARS]  $\rightarrow$  [COLOR BARS TYPE], select type of color bars.
  - The type of color bars can be selected from [SMPTE] or [FULL].



· A smear may occur depending on the output resolution.

#### Setting the audio test signal output

Sets if the audio test signal (tone signal of rating level 1 kHz) can be output or not when the color bars are displayed.

**1** Select the [OUTPUT SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [COLOR BARS]  $\rightarrow$  [TEST TONE]  $\rightarrow$  [ON].

### Audio input

The camera can record two channels of audio.

The audio to input to each channel can be switched to the built-in microphone, an external microphone, or a connected audio device.

### Switching the audio input

#### Audio recording format

The audio recording format such as compression format varies depending on the recording mode.

- f 2 Select the [AUDIO SETTINGS] menu o [AUDIO CH SETTINGS] o [CH2 IN SELECT] o [INT(R)].



To decrease the wind noise of the microphone, select the [AUDIO SETTINGS] menu → [AUDIO CH SETTINGS] → [CH1 MIC LOWCUT]/[CH2 MIC LOWCUT] → [ON].

### When using an audio device or an external microphone

- 1 Connect an audio device or an external microphone to the <AUDIO INPUT 1>/<AUDIO INPUT 2> terminal.
- 2 Set each item in the [AUDIO SETTINGS] menu ightarrow [AUDIO INPUT].

#### Adjusting the audio recording level

There are manual adjustment and automatic adjustment as the adjustment method of the audio recording level.

### Automatic adjustment of the recording level

### 1 Set the <CH1>/<CH2> switch to <AUTO>.

- Audio channel 1 and audio channel 2 can individually set.
- Following settings are disabled when the <CH1>/<CH2> switch is set to <AUTO>.
- Adjustment of the recording level by the <AUDIO LEVEL CH1>/<AUDIO LEVEL CH2> dial
- The [AUDIO SETTINGS] menu ightarrow [AUDIO CH SETTINGS] ightarrow [CH1 LIMITER]/[CH2 LIMITER] setting

#### Manual adjustment of the recording level

- 1 Set the <CH1>/<CH2> switch to <MANU>.
- f 2 Adjust the recording level with the <AUDIO LEVEL CH1>/<AUDIO LEVEL CH2> dial.
  - When the input level of audio exceeds 0 dB, the level display exceeding 0 dB is displayed in red in the audio level meter in the HOME screen. This is indicating that the input volume is too high.

Adjust so that the maximum value of the audio level does not exceed 0 dB.



• By setting the <CH1>/<CH2> switch to <MANU>, setting in the [AUDIO SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [AUDIO CH SETTINGS]  $\rightarrow$  [CH1 LIMITER]/[CH2 LIMITER] is enabled.

#### Recording standard level

The recording standard level can be set.

1 Select the [AUDIO SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [AUDIO CH SETTINGS]  $\rightarrow$  [HEAD ROOM]  $\rightarrow$  [18dB]/[20dB].

#### Confirming the audio input level

Input level of the audio can be confirmed in the HOME screen.



#### Monitoring the audio

Audio recorded with the camera can be heard with a speaker or headphones.

Audio is not output from the speaker during shooting.

#### Setting the output audio

Sets the audio channel and the format to be output from the headphone terminal.

- 1 Select the [AUDIO SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [AUDIO OUTPUT]  $\rightarrow$  [MONITOR OUT].
- 2 Select the type of audio.
  - [CH1]: Outputs the signal for audio channel 1 in monaural.
  - [CH2]: Outputs the signal for audio channel 2 in monaural.
  - [STEREO]: Outputs the signals for audio channel 1 and audio channel 2 in stereo.
  - [MIX]: Outputs the signals for audio channel 1 and audio channel 2 mixed into monaural.

#### Setting the audio delay

The audio from the headphone terminal can be delayed to match the monitor output.

 $\textbf{1} \ \ \text{Select the [AUDIO SETTINGS] menu} \rightarrow \text{[AUDIO OUTPUT]} \rightarrow \text{[MONITOR DELAY]} \rightarrow \text{[LIVE]/[RECORDING]}.$ 

[LIVE]: Audio is not delayed.

[RECORDING]: Audio is delayed to match the monitor output.

### **Direct volume control function**

The audio level can be adjusted with the multidial by assigning [MONITOR VOL] to the multidial that is to be used as the USER button in advance.

- To use as the USER button, set the <WB>/<USER>/<ISO/dB> switch to <USER>.
- Assigning [MONITOR VOL] to the multidial
- 1 Select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [USER SWITCHES] → [USER TOGGLE] → [MONITOR VOL].
- Using the direct volume control function
- 1 Set the <WB>/<USER>/<ISO/dB> switch to <USER>.

2 Operate the multidial to adjust the audio level.

### Confirming audio input setting

Setting of the audio input can be confirmed in the [AUDIO] screen.



1 Press the <INFO> while the HOME screen is displayed.

The INFO screen is displayed.

### 2 Select [AUDIO].

The [AUDIO] screen is displayed, and the settings of the [AUDIO SETTINGS] menu can be confirmed all at once.



Data including additional information such as image, audio, and meta data that are recorded by single shooting is saved as a clip. Playback, copy, etc., of the clip can be performed on the camera.

### Thumbnail operation

### Thumbnail operation overview

A clip is a group of data recorded by a single shooting, which includes additional information such as image, audio, and meta data.

The following operations can be performed while viewing the clip thumbnails displayed on the LCD monitor.

Playback, delete, and copy of a clip (only possible for a clip recorded in AVCHD)

There is a method to operate with the multidial or a grip multidial, or a method to operate by touching the LCD monitor.



The thumbnail screen is not displayed when the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [SYSTEM MODE] → [SDI RAW] is set to anything other than [OFF].

#### Thumbnail screen


The thumbnail screen is displayed when the <THUMBNAIL> button is pressed while the VIEW screen or the HOME screen is displayed.

Pressing the <THUMBNAIL> button again displays the VIEW screen.

To return to the HOME screen, press the <HOME> button.

The clips in the recording codec (MOV or AVCHD) selected in the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [SYSTEM MODE]  $\rightarrow$  [MAIN CODEC] is displayed in the thumbnail screen.

Also, menu in the thumbnail screen can be operated by pressing the <MENU> button while the thumbnail screen is displayed.



#### 1 Clip status display

[ALL SLOT]: Displays all the clips recorded on all the SD cards in each card slot. Displays in [ALL SLOT] when the thumbnail screen is displayed from the VIEW screen or the HOME screen.

[SLOT1]: Displays only the clips recorded on the SD card in card slot 1.

[SLOT2]: Displays only the clips recorded on the SD card in card slot 2.

[SLOT1 -> SLOT2]: Displays when copying from the SD card in the card slot 1 to the SD card in the card slot 2.

[SLOT2 - SLOT1]: Displays when copying from the SD card in the card slot 2 to the SD card in the card slot 1.

#### 2 Function display

This is displayed during the operation of copy, delete, protect, etc.

### 3 Recording mode

MOV: Displays when MOV is selected as the recording codec.

AVCHD: Displays when AVCHD is selected as the recording codec.

AVCHD: Displays when MOV is selected as recording codec, and if there is at least one AVCHD clip in any of the SD cards. This is not displayed if there is no AVCHD clip.

MOV: Displays when AVCHD is selected as recording codec, and if there is at least one MOV clip in any of the SD cards. This is not displayed if there is no MOV clip.

#### 4 Media status display

The card slot number of the SD card where the clip in the cursor position is recorded is displayed in yellow.

#### 5 Wireless LAN connection status display

Displays the connection status of the wireless LAN.

(No display): It is not connected to a wireless LAN. It is set to the [NETWORK SETTINGS] menu → [NETWORK SEL] → [OFF].

: A status where ROP is not connected.

: A status where ROP is connected.

#### 6 Power status display

: Indicates the remaining battery level while powered with the battery.

Displays when powered with the AC adaptor.

#### 7 Cursor

#### 8 Clip that cannot be played back

Displays when the clip cannot be played back in the camera such as standard violation.

#### 9 Page switching button

Switches the page of the thumbnail screen.



#### 10 Scroll bar

Indicates which part of the whole thumbnail is currently being viewed.

#### Display of the clips in the thumbnail screen

Normally, the number assigned to the clip in the order of recording is displayed.

#### 2 Resume play status

#### 3 Number of recorded pixels, system frequency

#### 4 Protection status of the clip

This is displayed when the clip is protected.

#### 5 Clip name

First eight digits of the file name of the clip is displayed in alphanumeric.

#### 6 Delete selection status

### 7 Clip that cannot be played back

This is displayed when the clip cannot be played back with the camera because the system frequency is different, etc.

### 8 Copy selection status

This is displayed when the clip is selected.

#### Display of clip information

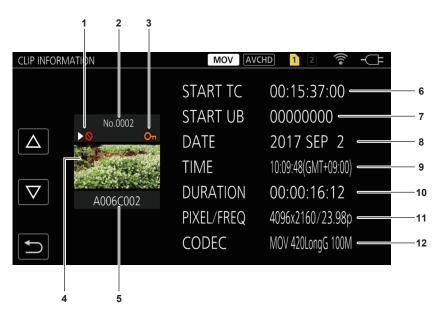
Displays the information of the clip where the cursor is positioned.

### 1 Move the yellow cursor to the clip to display the clip information.

### 2 Press the <INFO> button.

The clip information is displayed.

#### 1 Clip that cannot be played back

This is displayed when the clip cannot be played back with the camera because the system frequency is different, etc.

### 2 Thumbnail number

This is displayed when the clip is protected.

#### 4 Thumbnail image

5 Clip name

#### 6 [START TC]

Displays the time code value at the start of the recording.

#### 7 [START UB]

Displays the user bits value at the start of the recording.

### 8 [DATE]

Displays the date of the recording.

#### 9 [TIME]

Displays the time at the start of recording.

#### 10 [DURATION]

Displays the time length of the clip.

#### 11 [PIXEL/FREQ]

Displays the recording format of the clip.

#### 12 [CODEC]

Displays the recording codec of the clip.

## Copying clips

Clip can be copied between the SD cards.

Only the clip recorded in AVCHD can be copied.



#### Restoring clips

In following cases, an error message may be displayed and it may need restoration of the clip depending on the condition. It may take some time to restore depending on the error.

- When the SD card in the slot is taken out while the card 1 access lamp or the card 2 access lamp is flashing
- When the power is turned off by removing the battery or the AC adaptor while recording or performing record completion process

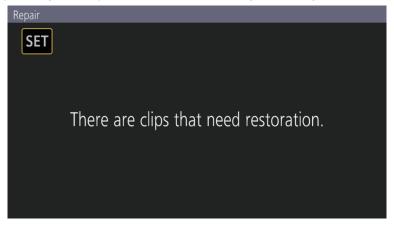

- Once the repair is completed, select 🔁 in the confirmation message. It will return to the previous screen.
- ! is displayed on the clip when an abnormal management information is detected while displaying the thumbnail.



- Do not remove the SD card in the slot with the card 1 access lamp/card 2 access lamp is flashing in orange or remove the battery or the AC adaptor when the lamp is flashing. Doing so will cause damage to the SD card.
- Use a sufficiently charged battery or AC adaptor.
- It may not be possible to completely repair depending on the condition of the data.
- To restore the clips, it is necessary that the clips are recorded for more than a certain amount of time. Especially in the following cases, the clips may not be restored, because the number of frames to be recorded is small.
- When the variable frame rate recording function is enabled, and the frame rate lower than the system frequency is set.
- When the interval recording function is enabled.
- · The clips shot before the power was turned off will not be able playback if the repair fails.

Also, it may not be possible to record any more.

- · If data recorded with other device is repaired, it may not be able to play back on the camera or other device.
- If the repair failed, turn off the camera, and turn it back on after waiting for a while. If the repair fails repeatedly, format with the camera. All data will be erased when it is formatted, and it cannot be restored.
- · Display of the thumbnail become slower when the thumbnail information is repaired.

## NOTE NOTE

- Operation of the camera or some of the operation may become slow for the clip with large file size.
- Operation of the camera or some of the operation may become slow when the there are large number of clips in the SD card.
- Playback will be paused when the [THUMBNAIL] menu → [PLAYBACK] → [SLOT SEL] → [ALL SLOT] is set and all clips in the SD cards are displayed. Playback is not possible across two SD cards.
- Playback will stop when the SD card is taken out while playing back.

When the playback of a clip is stopped midway, it will start the playback from the position that stopped the playback when it is played back the next time.






## **Chapter 8** Connecting to External Devices

This chapter describes the external devices that can be connected to the camera.

## Connecting with headphones and TV/monitor

## Headphones

Headphones (optional) can be connected to the headphone terminal (3.5 mm stereo mini jack).






· Audio is not output from the built-in speaker when headphones are connected to the headphone terminal.

#### TV/monitor

A TV or monitor can be connected as shown in the following figure.






- VIERA Link is not supported on the camera. Note that the VIERA Link of other device may not properly operate when connected to the VIERA Link compatible device with a HDMI cable (optional).
- $\cdot$  The SD resolution signal output from the <HDMI> terminal is output as a progressive signal (480P, 576P).
- For the BNC cable (optional) connected to the <SDI OUT> terminal, prepare a double-shielded cable equivalent to 5C-FB.
- Use the double shielded cable supporting 4K/60P as the HDMI cable (optional). Also, it is recommended to use the Panasonic HDMI cable compatible to 4K/60P as the HDMI cable.

## Remote operation by iPad or Android terminal

The camera can be connected to the wireless LAN by connecting a wireless module (optional) compatible to the camera to the <USB2.0 HOST> terminal of camera.

Some of the functions can be remotely operated by connecting the camera with an iPad or an Android terminal with EVA ROP app installed.



Following remote operation is possible using the EVA ROP app.

- Confirming the status of the camera
- Remote controlling of the camera



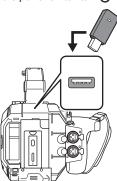

## Preparing to connect the iPad or Android terminal

## Mounting the wireless module

Mount the wireless module (optional) to the camera.

Before mounting or removing the wireless module, always turn the power switch to < (b) > (standby), and confirm that the power lamp is off.



- 1 Open the terminal cover for the <USB2.0 HOST> at the rear.
- 2 Connect the wireless module to the <USB2.0 HOST> terminal.

Insert it all the way.

# Chapter 9 Notes

Maintenance of the camera or frequently asked questions are described.

## Frequently asked questions

#### Power supply

- What is the power supply voltage supported by the supplied AC adaptor?
- AC 100 V-240 V
- Can the supplied AC adaptor used while the battery is mounted?
- It can be used. Supplying of the power is automatically switched to the AC adaptor side when the power is set to < > (ON) and the AC adaptor is connected while the battery is mounted.

The power status display in the LCD monitor will change from the mark to the

- The camera cannot be operated even when the power is set to < | > (ON).
- Remove the power supply (the battery or the AC adaptor), and connect it again after approximately one minute.
- 🛾 The operation of the corresponding button or the switch is disabled when the <LOCK> switch on the camera is set to < 角 >. Unlock if necessary.

### **Battery**

#### ■ The battery gets exhausted quickly, so is there any way to improve?

- Charge the battery sufficiently.
- The operating time becomes shorter in low temperature.
- If the time is short after sufficient charging, the battery life has expired.

#### ■ Can the battery that was used in the previous models used?

• VW-VBD58 (optional) can be used.

It is recommended to use the following Panasonic genuine batteries.

- AG-VBR59 (supplied/optional, 7.28 V, 5900 mAh)
- AG-VBR89 (optional, 7.28 V, 8850 mAh)
- AG-VBR118 (optional, 7.28 V, 11800 mAh)

#### ■ Can the supplied battery be charged with the battery charger AG-B23 (DE-A88) (optional)?

• It can perform normal charging. It cannot perform quick charging.

#### Battery charger

#### Can the previous battery charged with the supplied charger?

- It can perform normal charging.
- To perform quick charging, use the quick charging compatible battery. The camera is compatible to following quick charging compatible batteries.
- AG-VBR59 (supplied/optional, 7.28 V, 5900 mAh)
- AG-VBR89 (optional, 7.28 V, 8850 mAh)
- AG-VBR118 (optional, 7.28 V, 11800 mAh)

#### SD card

#### Operation is not accepted even when an SD card is inserted into the card slot.

• The SD card to be used on the camera should always be formatted on the camera.

The SD card formatted in a PC cannot be used in the camera.

#### Shooting

#### ■ The shooting stops by itself, and cannot shoot.

- When the recording format is set to MOV format, use the SDXC memory card. MOV format data cannot be recorded on the SDHC memory card.
- Use the SD card with required Speed Class in accordance with the recording bit rate. (page 47)

#### Audio cannot be recorded.

- Audio cannot be recorded in the following cases.
- When the variable frame rate recording function is enabled, and the frame rate is set different from the system frequency
- When the interval recording function is enabled
- When audio cannot be recorded, ③ is displayed in the HOME screen, and AREC is displayed in the VIEW screen.

#### Editing

#### ■ Can the camera be connected to a computer (Windows/Mac) via USB?

• The camera does not have an USB device terminal, so the camera cannot be connected to a PC via USB. Connect the commercially available SD card reader to a PC, and copy the contents (data) directly from the SD card.

## Playback

#### ■ The clip cannot be played back.

- The clip displaying ! in the thumbnail screen cannot be played back.
- ! is displayed on following clips.
- A clip shot with other device, a clip edited by an editing software
- Corrupted clip
- 🕒 🚫 is displayed on the clip in the thumbnail mode when the clip has different recording mode (MOV format/AVCHD format), or different system frequency. Change the system frequency or the recording codec.

#### ■ The clip cannot be erased.

- Cancel the protect on the clip.
- The clip displaying ! in the thumbnail screen may not be able to erase.

Format the SD card if the clip is unwanted.

All the data recorded on the SD will be erased when formatted. Save the necessary data into a PC, etc.

#### ■ Can the contents shot with AG-DVX200 or AG-UX180 be played back?

- The contents recorded in MOV format/MP4 format cannot be played back. The camera has changed the folder structure of the SD card to maintain the compatibility of the file name with the Panasonic VARICAM series (AU-V35LT1G etc.).
- The contents recorded in AVCHD format can be played back. Contents recorded in the format that cannot be recorded with the camera cannot be
  played back.

#### Others

#### ■ Can the wired remote control used with AG-DVX200 series be used?

• The controlling format is different, so it cannot be used.

## Updating the camera firmware

Confirm the firmware version of the camera in the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu  $\rightarrow$  [INFORMATION]  $\rightarrow$  [VERSION], and access the most current information regarding firmware in the website described in NOTE, and download the firmware if required.

## NOTE

- Update is completed by loading the downloaded file to the camera via the SD card. Insert the SD card that stores the update file into the card slot 1, and select the [SYSTEM SETTINGS] menu → [INFORMATION] → [UPDATE]. For update method, refer to the support desk at the following website: https://pro-av.panasonic.net/
- ${}^{\textstyle \bullet}$  Always perform update of the firmware with the LCD monitor unit mounted.
- When updating the firmware, use the AC adaptor or sufficiently charged battery.
- Do not turn off the power while updating the firmware. Rewriting of the firmware may fail and the camera may not be activated.

## Cleaning and storing

## Cleaning the camera body

- Remove the battery or disconnect the AC cable from the power outlet before cleaning.
- Do not use benzine or thinner to clean the camera. Using benzine or thinner may cause deformation or peeling off of the paint of the camera body.
- Wipe the camera body with a soft and clean cloth. If there is heavy dirt attached, wipe the camera recorder using a cloth soaked in kitchen detergent diluted with water, and then wipe it with a dry cloth.

### Cautions when storing the camera recorder

Remove the battery from the camera when storing. Store them in a place where humidity is low and temperature is relatively constant.

- Recommended temperature: 15 °C to 25 °C (59 °F to 77 °F)
- Recommended relative humidity: 40% to 60%

#### ■ Camera

• Wrap the camera recorder with a soft cloth so that dust does not get into it.

#### Battery

- The battery life shortens where the temperature is extremely high or low.
- · Storing in a place where there is heavy oil smoke or dust may lead to malfunctions due to rust on terminal connectors, etc.
- Do not let the battery terminal contact a metal object (such as a necklace or hairpin). Short circuit may occur between terminals and it may lead to heat generation. Touching on a heated part may cause severe burns.
- Store the battery with electrically discharged. When storing for a long period of time, it is recommended to charge the battery once a year, and then use up the battery capacity by the camera before storing it again.





- Do not place it in a high humid or dusty place.


